Students must take four core classes each year of junior high: English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Students are required to have Physical Education for two years. Beginning in the 7th grade, students may substitute their PE class with athletics.

Students are required to take a fine arts class for one year in junior high. If a student wishes to continue with fine arts classes in 7th and 8th grade, it will count as one of their elective credits.

Students who wish to participate in sports in 7th and 8th grade will have athletics as one of their elective credits.

*In 7th & 8th grade, or once the PE credit requirement is met, each year of athletics counts as 1 elective or 1 PE credit. Students who are in athletics will participate in off-season when their sport is over. Students who wish to participate in tennis or golf must designate this on their schedule request as it is considered a different class.
