#### ACT SCORES ON THE RISE AT TRI-VALLEY



Greetings,

The South Dakota Department of Education has recently released the 2021 ACT scores for South Dakota Public School Districts. Tri-Valley's district average is currently 22.91, which from

what we can go back and find, might be one of the highest scores ever for our school district. To put it into perspective, our students scored 1.3 points higher than the state average which is 21.61 for the 2021 year.

South Dakota schools must have a minimum of 10 students take the ACT to present the scores. Out of the 148 South Dakota public school districts, 101 of these schools met this threshold. Tri-Valley's scores came in as the 9<sup>th</sup> highest for the entire state.

A lot of work has been put into raising student achievement scores within our school district. It is fantastic to see this work paying dividends. This is a real credit to our staff, students, and parents who have helped promote their children taking courses with an increase in rigor.

Happy Spring! We are moving quickly through the spring semester. Registration for the 2022-23 school year, the beginning of the 4th quarter, and the start of spring activities all signal the rapidly approaching end of the school year. Once again, I would like to thank the students, staff, and community for a great school year!

Prior to the end of the school year, the junior class will participate in the state assessments. Assessments are given to juniors in the areas of science, math, and English. Our juniors tested extremely well last year in all three subject areas. In addition to providing students with feedback in the core subject areas, the state assessments are important in guiding our instructional staff. Students should get plenty of rest before the state assessments, and we encourage them to do their best. Testing dates this spring are English – April 11th-14th, math – April 20th – 22nd, science – April 27th & 28th. If you have any questions regarding the state assessments, please let me know.

Beginning this spring, the 9th and 10th-grade students will be taking the pre-ACT test. The pre-ACT assessment provides students with feedback in the areas of English, math, reading, and science. Data from the tests will be used in discussions with students regarding post-secondary planning and to help them determine potential career paths. Information from the pre-ACT will also be beneficial in helping meet our goal of providing meaningful academic guidance as our students choose courses throughout high school.

With May comes Graduation and the celebration of the academic accomplishments of the senior class. The Commencement ceremony is scheduled for Saturday, May 21st, at 2:00 p.m. in the high school gym. Everyone is welcome to attend and help the senior class celebrate their many accomplishments!

One last note, weather permitting, semester tests are scheduled for Wednesday, May 25th, and Thursday, May 26th. Student checkout will be following their last semester test on Wednesday or Thursday.

### CHROMEBOOK FEE FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents and Guardians of students in grades 6-11:

For the 2022-2023 school year, Tri-Valley will be reinstating the \$30 Chromebook fee for all students in grades 7-12 who take their school-issued Chromebook home. We have waived this fee for the last couple of years due to Covid. The fee is \$30 per student per year with a maximum of \$60 per family. Those families that have completed the food service free and reduced application and qualify for the program will receive a 50% discount on this fee.

This fee helps cover the cost of an added warranty to provide accidental damage protection. All repairs will be covered 100% by the school district unless the damage is considered intentional. Intentional damages will be repaired at the expense of the student/parents.

This fee will be available to be paid by check/cash to your student's homeroom/advisory teacher the first week of school in the Fall or can be paid online via Infinite Campus Parent Portal starting in July.

This is important and necessary information we need to support your student in his or her activity. Please complete this step. Your student will not be able to compete this year without this form completed.

### Step 3: Upload your physical


The physical document is available for download on the web page listed above. Print it off and bring it to your doctor to fill out. Scan a copy, save the file, and upload it to the website. Physicals are valid for one year, so if there is any chance your student will play a spring sport, wait until June to get it. Students cannot practice without a completed physical.

### SUMMER ACCELERATION INFORMATION

Tri-Valley Athletics is proud to offer one of the most successful and best attended large group training programs in the area run by highly qualified coaches. Acceleration will be offered to boys and girls going into grades 7-12. Acceleration will start on Tuesday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, and run Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday throughout the summer. The cost is \$100 per student for the 8 weeks of training. There will be a break for the summer moratorium from July 1<sup>st</sup> through the 7<sup>th</sup>. - 7:45 a.m.-9:15 a.m.: 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Boys




