From the desk of Mr. Fee

What's New for the 2018 - 2019 School Year

You may have become familiar with the phrase, "Make America Great Again!" Around here, we follow a similar commitment...."Make Easton Valley Great, Always!" (MEVGA)

Every year you can count on us to continuously improve our schools. The 2018-2019 school year will be no exception. Of course, we cannot continue to improve without help from you and all the members of our school community. I would like to take this time to thank everyone who has reached out to myself, our administrators, and other school leaders to provide input on how we can better serve our students and their families. Here are just a few of the many ways we hope to improve the Easton Valley school experience for the upcoming school year...

Transportation: After improving our before and after school bus shuttle system last year, we have made some adjustments to be even more efficient. This coming year, many of our stops will pick up approximately 20 minutes later in the morning. On top of that, we have reduced/eliminated the need for elementary students to sit in the gym to wait for school to start. When they arrive, they will be heading to their classrooms ready for the fun to begin.

- **Safety and Security:** Last year we refined our emergency response procedures. This year we will be implementing a new plan to practice age appropriate lockdown drills every month. We will also continue training our staff on ways to prevent and identify threats before they happen.
- **Professional Learning:** With the addition of early release days every other Wednesday last year, we have been able to improve the training our teacher's receive. While it can often be an inconvenience for families needing to make special arrangements, I can assure you that it is worth every minute. The additional professional learning time this coming year has afforded us the opportunity to bring in world class learning experiences for our educators. We are kicking the school year off by partnering with Andrew CSD to offer a conference to support the implementation of Professional Learning Communities (PLC's). PLC's are one of the main initiatives that we are continuing to increase for the learning of every student in our district. Other professional learning this coming year will address the issue of emotional intelligence and other ways to improve social/emotional learning for our students.
- **Student Learning Opportunities:** This year we are expanding our career and technical education opportunities for our students. Mr. Sikkema will be leading a new computer science strand that will expose students to all kinds of real world learning experiences. This summer he has been participating in an internship experience with Rockwell-Collins in Bellevue to learn how he can prepare students in his classroom with the skills and experiences they will need to excel in fields related to technology after they graduate. During the upcoming year we will continue workings with neighboring districts to identify innovative ways that we can grow our CTE programs and further prepare our students for 21st century career opportunities.
- **Facilities:** For the past couple of months our summer custodial and maintenance crew has done an incredible job preparing our schools for the upcoming year. Not only have they done a top-notch job, but they completed the work in record time. The final domino that would need to fall to put our schools on par with where they need to be would be the successful passing of a school bond referendum. Our school board has once again responded to the request made by members of our community to hold another special school election on September 11, 2018. Here is a general overview of the project that the community will be voting on:

Easton Valley Bond Referendum

Election Date: September 11, 2018

Voting Sites: Voter Precincts in Sabula, Miles, & Preston

Poll Hours: 7:00am - 8:00pm

Total Project Amount: \$9.95 million

Levy Amount: \$2.68 for a 20 year bond

Project Overview:

Easton Valley Elementary - Miles, Iowa

- Invest approximately \$8 million

> Needs include, but not limited to:

- Secure entrance to protect against threats to children and staff
- Safe vehicle pick up/drop off area
- Deconstruct 100+ year old building, rebuild single story for accessibility
- Enhance security system to protect against threats
- Provide plumbing for preschool classroom needs
- Mitigate safety issues such as; crumbling/falling plaster ceilings, unsafe fire escapes, etc.

Easton Valley Middle School/High School, Preston, Iowa

- Invest approximately \$1.5 million

> Needs include, but are not limited to:

- Enhance security system to protect against threats to students and staff
- Address handicap accessibility issues
- Provide adequate JH/HS lab space for 21st century learning in science and agriculture

Additional Info:

The Easton Valley School Board has reduced property taxes for 2018-19 and into the foreseeable future. Our property tax rates have dropped to \$12.52 per \$1000 taxable property value, while keeping the income surtax at 4%. (FY17 tax rate for EV was \$15.08) Passing the bond would put the tax rate at approx. \$15.00 per \$1000 of **assessed** value for next year and beyond. See the simplified table below along with the financial data prepared by Piper Jaffray Financial Consultants attached to this email.

From the desk of Mr. Johnson

Here we go again!

It's that time of year where we prepare for another great school year at Easton Valley. We have some new handbook policy changes that I wanted to make sure and highlight. Also, our students in the JH/HS will be receiving their NEW Chromebooks on our open house night.

Handbook changes for the 2018-2019 school year

Activity Eligibility

Each student participating in extracurricular activities will be required to pass all classes each quarter. It will be determined as follows:

A. Eligibility will be figured every quarter. If a student is failing at quarter, they are ineligible for 4 weeks; at that time, another grade check will occur and if the student is still not at passing, they remain ineligible.

B. This ineligibility will remain with the student until the time is served.

If not passing all classes at end of a final grading period, student is ineligible for first period of 30 consecutive calendar days in the interscholastic athletic event in which the student is a contestant. There is no requirement that the student competed in the sport previously; however, the student must remain in good standing throughout the season in order for their eligibility to be reinstated.

Good Conduct Reinstatement Schedule:

1st Offense: Three weeks (21 days) from the first performance or event date. Students who are NOT involved in extracurricular school activities will miss the following school functions (ex. Homecoming dance, Prom, school trip). Determining a qualifying function will be at the discretion of the administration.

2nd Offense: Nine weeks (63 days) with a minimum of three performances or events from the first performance or event date. Students who are NOT involved in extracurricular school activities will miss all school functions (ex. Homecoming dance, Prom, school trip). Determining a qualifying function will be at the discretion of the administration. Student must also complete an administrative-approved counseling program at their own cost.

3rd Offense: One year (365 days) from the date of the finding of a good conduct violation. Students who are NOT involved in extracurricular school activities will miss all school functions (ex. Homecoming dance, Prom, school trip). Determining a qualifying function will be at the discretion of the administration. Student must also complete an administrative-approved counseling program at their own cost.

4th Offense & Beyond: Student is prohibited from participating in any performances or events (Homecoming dance or Prom) for the remainder of their high school career.

Tardies

Students tardy to school will not be admitted to school without the written permission of the principal/or designee. Students tardy to class will not be admitted to class without written permission to enter class from the office or from the school employee responsible for the tardiness. Once a student accumulates three tardies, they serve a detention with the teacher from whose class they are tardy; if a student doesn't serve the detention when assigned, they receive an in-school suspension (ISS) the following day. Students tardy to class by more than ten minutes will be considered as absent unexcused for that class period. Parents will be contacted when their student receives the ISS. The opportunity to makeup work missed due to an unexcused tardy or absence is at the discretion of the teacher.

Open House and 7th Grade Orientation August 19th at the JH/HS

Our open house is on Sunday, August 19th from 4PM to 6PM. Students will be able to set-up their lockers for the school year and pick up their NEW Chromebooks. There will be a form that needs to have parental/a guardian's signature to receive the device so please be prepared. Also on that night we will be hosting our 7th graders and their parents for a 7th grade orientation at 5PM.

2018-2019 School Year Bus Pickup Times

- On average, students will be picked up 20-30 minutes later than they currently are for the next school year.
 - For example: If your child gets on the bus at 6:45 am, now they will not be picked up until after 7 am.
- Pick up location will still remain the same in all communities.
- **Dismissal times will not be affected by the morning route change!**

Elementary Beginning of Day Changes

Due to the later pick up times for the elementary students, **the school building will not be open until 7:50 am.** All students entering the building at 7:50 am will be in the lunchroom even if they are not eating breakfast until 8:00 am.

- Breakfast will start at 7:50 am when the school building opens.
- Tardy bell will ring at 8:25 am. Students who arrive after this time, will need to check in at the office and take a pass to their classroom teacher.

CONCUSSION FORMS

PLEASE READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Reminder to ALL students/parents of the Iowa Code pertaining to concussions. All students in grades 7-12 who participate in extracurricular activities **MUST** read and complete the **HEADS UP - Concussion in High School Sports** form annually. Athletes must also complete an annual sports physical. Both of these forms can be found in the high school office.

The Iowa Legislature passed a new law, effective July 1, 2011, regarding students in grades 7 - 12 who participate in extracurricular interscholastic activities. Please note this important information from Iowa Code Section 280.13C, Brain Injury Policies:

- (1) A child must be immediately removed from participation (practice and competition) if his/her coach or a contest official observes signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a concussion or brain injury in an extracurricular interscholastic activity.
- (2) A child may not participate again until a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions and brain injuries has evaluated him/her and the student has received written clearance from that person to return to participation.

Welcome Back!

Students may pick up their schedules at registration. I will be available on registration days during the day from 8am to 3pm for anyone that would like to stop in. Students may also come in the week before school starts if they need to see me. If there are conflicts with class times on your schedule, there will be a note on the schedule to see me to work out your classes. If you didn't turn one in, you will need to see me before school starts. Students will have 4 days to drop and add classes.

Students taking online classes need to check their CCC portal and double check they are enrolled in the correct college online classes. You may also come in and get your books from me if I have the one(s) you need. If I don't, you will need to pick them up at CCC before the first day. Please make sure you have given your \$250 check to the office as well. College classes start right away on August 20th. Online student orientation will be on August 15th at 2:00pm at the high school







Service Learning A graduation requirement



Service Learning is a teaching and learning strategy that integrates meaningful community service with instruction and reflection to enrich the learning experience, teach civic responsibility, and strengthen communities.

Freshmen through Seniors will be required to complete service learning projects, which constitutes the required hours of volunteer service based on your grade, to be served outside of school class time. These service hours may begin during the last month of your 8th grade, Freshman, Sophomore, Junior year (May). These hours must be completed by April 30th of each year. **Half of the service hours need to be completed by the end of the first semester in order to be eligible to play sports.** You may begin keeping track of your service hours for the 2018-2019 school year on May 1st, 2018.

Freshmen and Sophomores are required to have 10 service hours each year.



Juniors and Seniors are required to have 20 service hours each year.

Service hours **do not** require prior approval with the exception of sporting events being worked at; eg- score-keeping, stats, line judging etc. This is because the coaches need to know prior to the game who will be doing this for them.

Back to School Driver's Safety From Your Transportation Director

School days bring congestion: Yellow school buses are picking up their charges, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school, and hurried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work.

It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present - especially before and after school.

If You're Dropping Off

Schools often have very specific drop-off procedures for the school year. Make sure you know them for the safety of all kids. More children are hit by cars near schools than at any other location, according to the National Safe Routes to School program. The following apply to all school zones:

- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles
- Don't load or unload children across the street from the school
- Carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school
- Remember to share the road
- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn
- In a school zone, stop at the stop sign and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk
- Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas
- Don't honk or rev your engine to scare a pedestrian, even if you have the right of way
- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians
- **Never, ever pass a stopped school bus from either direction dropping off or picking up students when their red lights are flashing and their stop sign arm is extended. This is against the law.** Students that are being dropped off, may be crossing the street in front of the school bus and are assuming that all drivers are obeying the stopped school bus sign. Be very vigilant as younger children are often unpredictable, and they tend to ignore hazards and take risks.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

We would like to remind parents of a few items to complete before the beginning of the 2018/2019 school year.

Preschool

Students entering Preschool need to have the following:

- ◆ Annual School Physical Exam (state requirement)
- ◆ Immunization Record (state requirement)
- ◆ Vision Screening (recommended)

Kindergarten

Students entering Kindergarten need to have the following:

- ◆ School Physical Exam (recommended)
- ◆ Immunization Record (state requirement) Boosters are needed
- ◆ Lead screening (state requirement)
- ◆ Dental screening (state requirement)
- ◆ Vision screening (state requirement)

3rd graders

Third grade students are required by the state of Iowa to have a vision screening assessment. It has been estimated that as much as 80% of what a person learns during the first 12 years of life, is the product of the sense of vision.

7th graders

The Iowa Department of Public Health require all students entering 7th grade, receive the Tdap and Meningococcal vaccine prior to the beginning of school. The Meningococcal vaccine is a new requirement this year. There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of these requirements.

9th graders

Iowa law requires students entering the 9th grade to have a dental screening. Screenings can only be performed by a dentist or dental hygienist. The purpose of the law is to improve the oral health of Iowa's children. Healthy teeth make it possible for your child to eat, speak, learn, and feel confident smiling.

12th Graders

The state has a new requirement for students entering the 12th grade to be vaccinated with the meningococcal vaccine. Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings and typically affects older teens and young adults. There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement.

Junior High/High School students

JH/HS students that plan to participate in any school sports, will be required to have an updated annual athletic physical before practice begins every year that they participate in sports during their junior high/high school years.

The forms needed are available in the high school office.



NUTRITION

FREE AND REDUCED MEALS

Easton Valley Community Schools provides all students an Iowa Eligibility Application, which is mailed out to their homes during the summer. Families who may qualify for free and reduced meals for the upcoming school year, are encouraged to complete the form when they receive it in the mail. Families who are directly certified through the state, will receive a direct certification letter and do not need to complete the Iowa Eligibility Application.

Families may apply for meal benefits any time during the school year. Free and reduced meal eligibility is strictly confidential.

Families who qualify for free meals, must have money in their account for any extra and a la carte items the students may purchase that is in addition to the regular main breakfast and lunch. Families who qualify for reduced meals, must have money in their account to cover the reduced price meals and any extras, and a la carte items.

Applications may be mailed back to the school, or returned at registration. They will be processed within 3 business days and families will receive a mailed response as to the status of their application. For more information, please contact Sharon Jargo at (563) 689-3431 Ext 2110.

Fee Waiver

If your child(ren) qualify for free and reduced price meals, they may also be eligible for other benefits. Complete the waiver form that is attached to the application and return it at the same time.

Food Allergies

If your child has a food allergy, and you would like the school to make a modification for him/her, you must have a Diet Modification form filled out and signed by your child's licensed physician and returned to school. For more information, please contact any of the school nurses.

Meal Requirements

Schools across the United States offer meals to students that meet the reimbursement guidelines from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). School meals are priced as a unit, and we receive federal and state reimbursement to offset our costs.

To get the most for your money, encourage your child(ren) to purchase a complete meal.

For breakfasts, students may choose:

- ◆ 1 serving Milk (1/2 pint fluid milk)
- ◆ 1 serving 4 oz. fruit juice OR fruit
- ◆ 1 or 2 servings Grain, meat/meat alternative (which includes the dairy entrée)

If students choose at least 3 components (milk, fruit, grain, and/or meat/meat alternate), their breakfast will be at the reimbursable meal rate. If they only choose 2 components, we must charge for each item separately, as the selections would not meet the USDA'S requirements for a complete reimbursable meal.

For lunch, students may choose:

- ◆ 1 serving Milk (1/2 pint fluid milk)
- ◆ 1 serving Fruit
- ◆ 1 serving Vegetable
- ◆ 1 serving Grain
- ◆ 1 serving Meat/Meat Alternate

If students choose at least 3 components (milk, fruit, vegetables, grain, meat/meat alternate) with one being a fruit and/or vegetable (1/2 cup minimum), their lunch will be at the reimbursable meal rate. If they only choose 2 components, or do not take a fruit or vegetable, we must charge for each item separately, as the selections would not meet the USDA's requirement for a complete reimbursable meal.

Our kitchen staff always have a complete selection of all the above for students to choose from.

Public Release

The Iowa Department of Education, Bureau of Nutrition and Health Services, today announced its policy for free and reduced price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program and the After-school Care Snack Program.

State and Local school officials have adopted the following family size and income criteria for determining eligibility:

Households may be eligible for free or reduced price meal benefits one of four ways listed below.

- Households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for reduced price meals or free meals, if they complete an Application for Free and Reduced Price School Meals/Milk. Households may complete one application listing all children and return it to your child's school. When completing an application, only the last four digits of the social security number of the household's primary wage earner or another adult household member is needed.
- Food Assistance households, children receiving benefits under the Family Investment Program (FIP) and children in a few specific Medicaid programs are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Most children from Food Assistance and FIP households will be qualified for free meals automatically. These households will receive a letter from their children's schools notifying them of their benefits. Households that receive a letter from the school need to do nothing more for their children to receive free meals. No further application is necessary. If any children were not listed on the notice of eligibility, the household should contact the school to have free meal benefits extended to them. Households must contact the school if they choose to decline meal benefits.
- Some Food Assistance and FIP households will receive a letter from the Department of Human Services (DHS) which will qualify the children listed on the letter for free meals. Parents must take this letter to the child's school to receive free meals.
- Food Assistance or FIP households receiving benefits that do not receive a letter from DHS must complete an application with the abbreviated information as indicated on the application and instructions, for their children to receive free meals. When the application lists an Assistance Program's case number for any household member, eligibility for free benefits is extended to all children in a household.


