THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

Boothbay Region High School is a comprehensive public high school offering a wide selection of opportunities for its nearly 210 students, particularly for those planning to pursue postsecondary education. Boothbay Region High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc.

A peninsula nestled on the rocky coast of Maine, the Boothbay Region consists of several towns, each with its own characteristics. AOS 98 supports Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor, Southport, Edgecomb and Georgetown. The Boothbay Region has a winter population of 7,500 and a summer population of 25,000. The region is known for its strong community support and involvement in the local schools.

In December 2014, BRHS was chosen as an Apple Distinguished School. BRHS students created an iBook highlighting the technology used by the school population and how it enhances the learning environment. The 2015 and 2016 "Best High Schools in Maine" report generated by *U.S. News & World Report* ranked BRHS number nine.

GRADING SYSTEM

The grading system for BRHS is a traditional 100-point scale:

A+ 100-98 • A 97-93 • A- 92-90
B+ 89-87 • B 86-83 • B- 82-80
C+ 79-77 • C 76-73 • C- 72-70
D+ 69-67 • D 66-63 • D- 62-60
F below 60 (no credit)
P = Pass, F = Fail

Students' cumulative GPA's are weighted based upon the following formula: one point is added to a student's cumulative GPA for each AP class he/she has successfully completed. Please note that seniors enrolled in AP courses will receive their extra point at the end of first semester. Students taking semester-long AP courses will receive one half point added to their cumulative GPA. Students may also earn points for courses taken through four-year, accredited colleges/universities, a half point per semester course. Semester grades are calculated using the following formula: Quarter 1: 45%, Quarter 2: 45%, Final Exam: 10%.

Habits of Work Grades

In addition to being graded on academic performance, students receive Habits of Work (HOW) grades related to attendance, participation, effort and other behaviors critical to academic and life success.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

At the start of the 2017-2018 school year, BRHS implemented a hybrid, semester-block schedule.

Students enroll in 8 courses each year, four of which are semester-long courses that meet every day for half a year. The other four courses run all year but meet on alternating blue and gold days (every other day). Classes meet for 72 minutes every day, and is a daily 53-minute, school-wide study hall during which all teachers are available to provide extra support to students. Prior to the 2017-2018 school year, BRHS utilized a semester block schedule. Students enrolled in 24 credits each year—12 credits (4 courses) first semester and 12 credits (4 courses) second semester. All four classes met each day for 76 minutes.

Students must earn 24 Carnegie Units (72 credits) to graduate from Boothbay Region High School.

Academic Highlights

- Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (H) and College Preparatory (CP) courses are offered in most content areas. Honors courses are offered in English, history and science. Students have access to on-line courses at all levels.
- AP courses offered to the class of 2018 include: AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP English Language & Composition, AP English Literature & Composition and AP Psychology. Many of our students also participate in AP4ALL courses. For more information: <http://maine.gov/doe/ap4all/>
- Dual Enrollment (early college) is offered to all seniors and juniors in their second semester allowing them to participate in on-line, ITV, or on-site college courses offered through our local community colleges and state universities.
- The Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC) enables juniors and seniors to enroll in vocational programs as part of their course load.
- Students may also participate in credit-recovery classes through the online PLATO program and are given a grade of "pass" and 3 credits upon successful completion of the online course. Grades received when a student retakes a course do not replace the original failing grade.
- All students are required to complete 20 hours of community service before graduating.
- Students in their senior year can participate in a work study/mentorship established with local businesses and organizations.
- BRHS has created one of the state's few STEM Academies. This allows us to offer students cutting edge courses that provide a "hands on" approach to learning, while integrating essential academic core skills and content. The following courses were offered to the class of 2017: Advanced Applied Physics-Robotics, Cars & Sparks, Furniture, Graphic Computer Programming, Engineering, Musical Instruments, Biotechnology, Marine Technology, Programming in Java, Applied Math & Science, Probability & Statistics, and Meteorology & Astronomy.

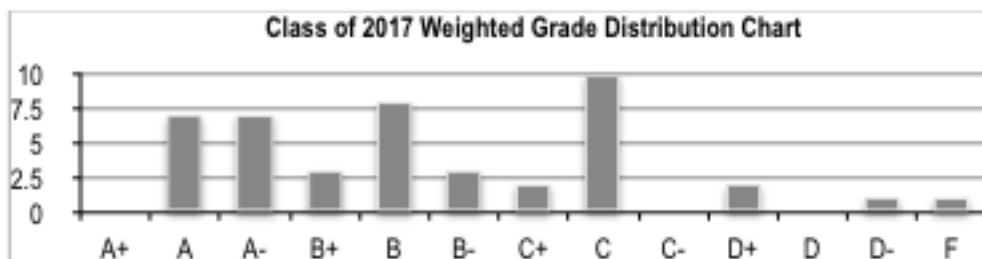
