FROM THE DESK OF BETH HENCH

It is hard to believe that we have already begun the 4th quarter of the 2021-2022 school year! We have so much to look forward to during these next few months: an exciting spring sports season, Ayersville Community Day (see p. 4), Kindergarten Screening, prom, elementary field days, and graduation to name a few. I hope you enjoy reading through this newsletter and learning about all the amazing things we have to be proud of in Pilot Nation.

Full Scale Safety Drill - On March 18, Ayersville worked with the Defiance County Sheriff's Office, 911 Center, and Highland Township Fire Department to complete a state mandated full scale safety drill. The purpose of our drill was to practice the next step of accountability if an emergency situation ever arises. Close to 100 staff and student volunteers participated in the drill and learned a lot about behind the scenes safety precautions. As we worked through the planning and execution of the drill, we realized ways our plans can be tweaked in order to improve safety of students and staff.

One suggestion that was made after past safety drills was to increase security around the various glass vestibules leading into the district. Ayersville was awarded just over \$3,700 from the Ohio School Safety Training Grant. These funds were earmarked for the purchase and installation of perforated vinyl window film to cover our glass vestibules. The window films not only look great, but more importantly, they increase the safety of our students and staff.

Natatorium and Income Tax Levy Information - Ayersville Local Schools will again have 2 levies on the ballot during the 2022 Primary Election:

- 1% income tax renewal (no new taxes)
 - Raises about \$1 million annually to support general fund expenses
 - Will cost \$500 for an income of \$50,000
- 1.3 mills current expenses levy (natatorium)
 - Will raise about \$130,000 annually to support the pool
 - O Will cost \$45.50 for a home valued at \$100,000

If you have questions about the levies and/or the financial situation of the district, please visit the "Menu" tab of the district webpage (ayersville.org), under "Community", click "Levy". In that same spot, you can also find a link to electronically submit a question or request for more information. During the past November General Election, the income tax renewal failed by 89 votes and the natatorium renewal levy failed by 2 votes. When Election Day comes, please take the time to cast an informed vote. Every vote matters.

I would like to introduce the two new staff members in the Treasurer's office this year. Melissa Kern started July 2021 as our new Assistant Treasurer. Her main responsibilities include processing payroll, adding new employees to the financial system, processing insurance information, quarterly and yearly reporting, along with all other payroll-related issues. This position was reduced to 20 hours per week down from 40 in 2020. Melissa and her husband are alumni of Ayersville; they have two students in the district and a third that is a future Ayersville Pilot.

Jen Baldwin Noaker has taken over as the Fiscal Specialist. This position was recently reduced from 32 to 20 hours per week. Jen's husband is an alumnus of Ayersville; they have two grown children that are also alumni and one that is currently a student in the district. Jen's responsibilities include processing purchase orders, sending invoices for approval, entering invoices to be paid, cash collection and daily deposits, receipts, as well as many other duties associated with the finances of the district.

In an effort to be more transparent, the district is now providing financial information on the Ohio Checkbook which serves as the singular and most trusted resource for Ohioans to obtain both local and state financial information. The Ohio Checkbook is a result of a joint initiative from two first-of-their-kind sites, Ohiocheckbook.com and Ohio's Interactive Budget. The collective effort enhances government transparency by providing real-time state financial and transactional data. Users can view online government spending, as well as how revenue is allocated. This website can be accessed at https://checkbook.ohio.gov.

Did you know that a monthly financial report is posted to our website each month? This report provides easy-to-understand information regarding the district finances. You can find these reports by clicking on "Documents" and going to the "Treasurer" folder.


 It's everything Ayersville Local Schools, in your pocket.

Grant Funding Awarded:

Ayersville was recently awarded \$11,760 through the Emergency Connectivity Fund Program (ECF). This program provides funding to schools for the reasonable costs of laptop and tablet computers. The district is using the grant to purchase iPads to help support learning throughout the district.
