Each year in the spring, we begin the process of placing children into homerooms for the following school year. The goal of the process is developing balanced classes of children. Welcome back from Spring break! I hope everyone had a chance to relax and spend some quality time with their families. The month of April brings classroom guidance to personal safety, and body changes. Our 4K-2 students at Black Earth will cover personal body safety during guidance class. We will discuss the difference between good and bad touches, who they should tell if they feel uncomfortable with touches, and their ability to say "No!" The second part of the month will be focused on healthy food choices. We will talk about the five food groups, fruits, vegetables, dairy, meat, and grains, and how each category provides our body with nutrients to grow and to be healthy. Talk with your student about the healthy food choices you make as a family at home!

Our 3-5 students at Mazomanie have been covering personal safety information. We have talked about the importance of knowing their information by memory if it was needed in an emergency situation. Please take this time to "quiz" your student on their address, phone number, birthdate and other important information. We will start the month with lessons on Human Growth and Development. Our school nurse, Mrs. Howe and myself will be covering hygiene with third grade students and promoting healthy habits for personal cleanliness and health. Fourth and fifth grade will cover puberty and personal body changes for both boys and girls. Look for handouts to be coming home to help guide your discussion on puberty with your students.

Scholarships Received from College or Other Outside Sources

On Scholarship Evening, we would like to recognize students who have been awarded scholarships from the school they will be attending next year or from other outside sources. If you have received notification of a scholarship from a college or group not included in our WHEF and Other Local Scholarship Booklet, please see Ms. Shaffer for an Outside Scholarship Award form. All forms are due to the guidance department no later than Monday, May 7th.

Taking the ACT or SAT

The ACT and the SAT are national tests which colleges use as part of the admission process. All of our juniors took the ACT with writing on February 27 and the results may be used for college admissions. Later tests will be offered outside the school in April, June, September, October and December. Many students will take a test more than once, in an effort to improve their score. Most schools in the Midwest prefer the ACT. However, you should check with any school you are considering applying to, to find out which they would like you to take and whether they require the writing portion of the test. All juniors interested in attending a four-year college or a UW system school should take one or the other. Students are encouraged to take the practice tests to familiarize themselves with the test (http://www.act.org/content/dam/act/unsecured/documents/Preparing-for-the-ACT.pdf) or (http://knowhow2go.acenet.edu/). Madison College (formerly known as MATC) does not require the ACT although it could be helpful when applying for certain programs.

Kindergarten & 6th Grade Required Immunizations

Immunization is the single most important way parents can protect their children against serious diseases.

☑ Help keep your child healthy and in school.

☑ Help protect the health of your community!

Kindergarten Required Immunizations

DTaP (4+ doses) (Last dose on or after 4th birthday) Protects against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis.

- Diphtheria a throat infection that can lead to breathing problems, paralysis, and death
- Tetanus causes severe tightening of muscles, which can limit swallowing and breathing
- Pertussis (whooping cough) a contagious disease and makes it hard to breathe

IPV (3+ doses) (last dose on or after the 4th birthday) Protects against poliovirus which can lead to paralysis and death

MMR (2 doses) Protects against measles, mumps, and rubella

- Measles causes high fever and a rash; can lead to serious complications
- Mumps causes fever, headache, and swelling under the jaw
- Rubella causes fever, rash, and soreness or swelling of the joints.

Hepatitis B (3+ doses) Protects against Hepatitis B virus that can cause liver disease, including cancer Varicella (2 doses) Protects against chicken pox that can cause fever and itchy rash. Can lead to skin infection, scars, and pneumonia.

6th Grade Required Immunizations

TDaP (1 dose) Given usually summer before 6th grade begins (10-11 years old)

Other Recommended Vaccines

Hepatitis A (2 doses) Protects against Hepatitis A virus that can cause fever, nausea, and jaundice

Influenza (1 dose annually) Protects against flu that causes fever, tiredness, cough, and runny nose. Can lead to pneumonia.

Meningococcal (2 doses) Protects against Meningitis which can cause flu-like symptoms and inflammation of brain and spinal cord (11-12 years old with a booster at 16)

HPV (2 doses) Protects against Human Papillomavirus which can lead to cancer (11-12 years old)
