Mr. Turrell reported on the sump pump in the elementary. A jump rope had gotten caught in the motor which caused all kinds of problems. The bids for bus-barn siding, apartment renovations, and roofing are due tomorrow. Mr. Turrell will have a comparison at the next meeting so a decision can be made on all the projects. Mr. Turrell addressed the roof. The insurance money does not seem sufficient to do anything adequate in terms of replacing the roof. We are having the insurance company come back out to re-assess the damage. Mr. Turrell is hoping the insurance money can be used as the 50% match for a BEST grant through the state. The Garland Company can help us with a grant and the repair process. Mr. Turrell plans on having them present information at the December meeting.
