


"It's Not Living (If It's Not With You)" by The 1975

you who aren't catching the drift, he meant thanks. That's just how British the man is.)



Egg-cellent Recipes

Deviled Eggs

Prep time: 45 minutes

Yields: 12 halves

Ingredients

- 6 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 to 2 dashes Tabasco sauce, to taste
- Salt, to taste
- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon snipped fresh chives
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- Paprika, for garnish
- Whole fresh chives, for garnish

Directions

1. Rinse eggs with warm water, and place in a small saucepan. Cover with cold water, place the pan over medium-high heat and bring to a boil. Turn off heat, cover and let sit for 10-12 minutes. Drain, rinse under cold water and peel. Cool in the refrigerator, loosely covered, for 15 minutes.
2. Halve eggs lengthwise, and carefully scoop out yolks. Place yolks in a bowl, and mash with a fork. Add mustard, Tabasco, salt, pepper and snipped chives. Stir in mayonnaise.
3. Fill each egg white with about 1 1/2 teaspoons of the egg-yolk mixture and

dust the top with paprika. Arrange in a spoke design on a platter; garnish with whole chives.



Egg-cellent Cont.

Easter Cookies

Bake: 15 minutes

Chill: 2 hrs and 15 minutes

Rest: 1 hr

Decorate: 15 minutes

Total: 4 hrs and 5 minutes

Yields: 2 dozen cookies

Ingredients

Cookies

- 1 ½ cups butter, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 ¾ cups all-purpose flour, sifted

Icing

- 6 cups powdered sugar
- 2 tablespoons meringue powder
- ½ teaspoon lemon juice
- Food coloring paste or drops


Directions

1. Make the cookies: Beat butter, sugar, and salt at medium speed with a heavy-duty electric stand mixer until creamy. Add vanilla; beat until well blended. Gradually add flour, beating at low speed until blended. (Dough will be very soft.)
2. Divide dough into 2 equal portions; wrap each with plastic wrap, and flatten into a disc. Chill 2 to 24 hours.
3. Preheat oven to 350°. Unwrap 1 dough disc on a well-floured surface. Cover with a large piece of plastic wrap, and roll to ¼-inch thickness; cut into

desired shapes with 3 ½-inch cookie cutters. Place 1 inch apart on un-greased baking sheets. Chill 15 minutes. Repeat procedure with remaining dough disc.

4. Bake at 350° for 14 to 17 minutes or just until edges are lightly browned. Cool on baking sheets 5 minutes. Transfer to wire racks, and let cool completely (about 30 minutes).
5. Meanwhile, make the icing: Whisk together first 3 ingredients and 6 to 8 Tbsp. water until smooth. Divide mixture into 5 to 6 small bowls; tint icing in each bowl with desired food coloring paste or drops, stirring until blended.
6. Decorate cookies with icing as desired. Let stand 1 hour or until icing is firm.





