Mid-Year Assessments: What are they?

In education, we use many acronyms that can be confusing to people who are not educators. As we enter our mid-year assessment time, I want to inform you of the different ways we monitor the progress of our students learning.

DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills): This assessment is a series of very short tests (1-3 minutes) and will be used to assess all grade K-4 students' foundational reading skills:

- hearing and using sounds (phonemic awareness)
- knowing the sounds of letters and sounding out words (phonics)
- fluent and accurate reading
- vocabulary
- comprehension

iReady: This program measures a student's progress on both literacy and math standards and can determine which grade level students are at in learning. These assessments are given to all students K-4. They vary in length depending upon grade level. They are given at the beginning, middle, and end of the year to determine progress. **AVMR (Add+Vantage Math Recover):** This is a math intervention program where students are assessed throughout the school year and placed in intervention groups to "fill gaps" that may prevent grade level mathematical learning. At Franklin, we have rotating small groups that meet for 8 weeks to focus on specific skills that students are missing. Some areas that are targeted include identifying numbers, counting, understanding grouping and re-grouping, and addition/subtraction/ multiplication/division.

All of these assessments are used to determine what is needed to support students in interventions and enrichment activities. This data is used as evidence when creating academic and behavioral plans and recommending students for a 504 or special education testing.
