

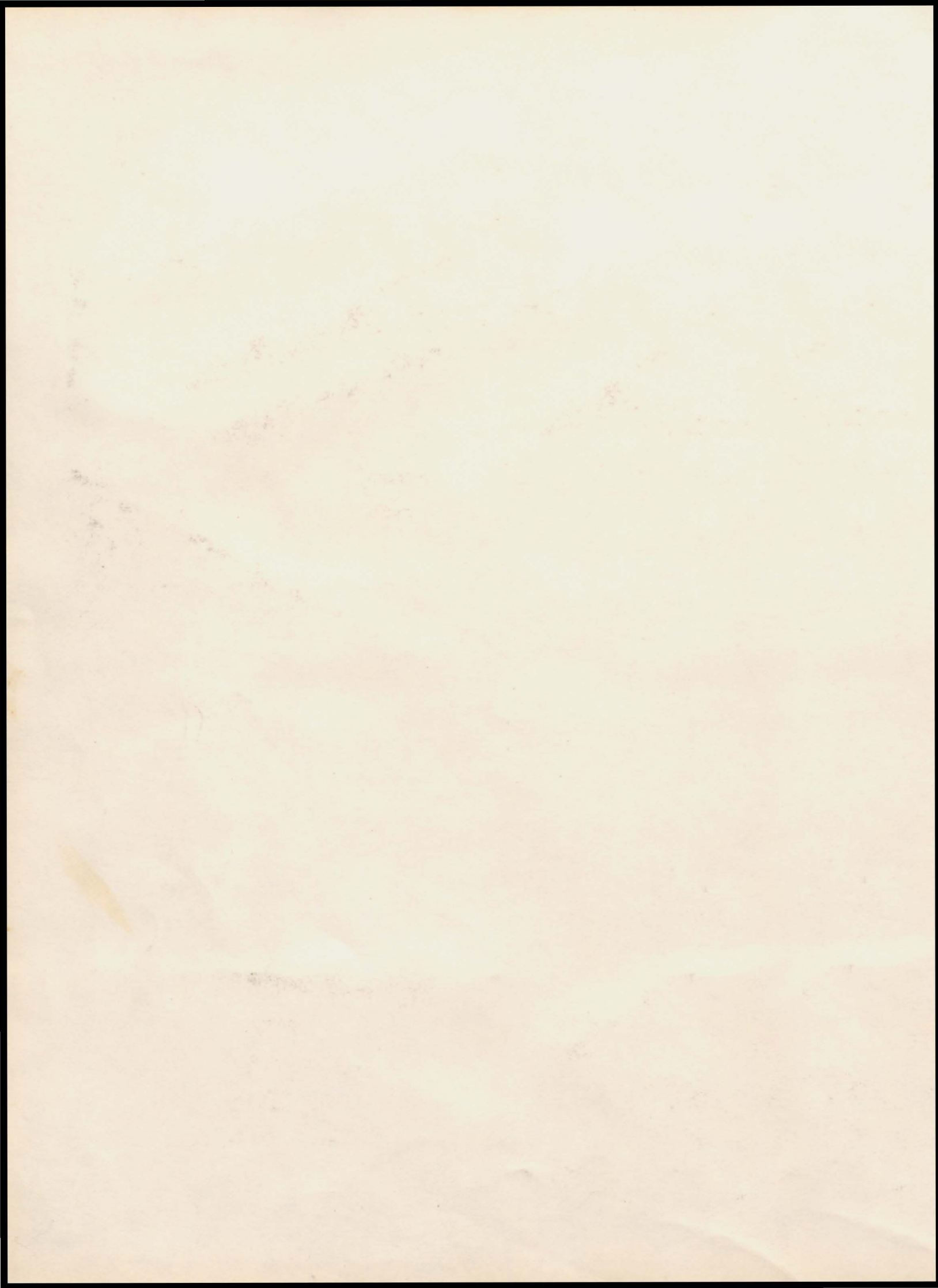

To the Student Body:

Today a job, rather than the first pair of long pants, is the symbol of acceptance into the world of adults. Jobs for young people, it seems, are harder to earn and there are now more than one million youth between the ages of 16 and 24 in, symbolically, short pants. The unemployment rate among young people already is higher than it was during the Great Depression, and it is close to three times the rate for the labor force as a whole.

The postwar baby boom has something to do with it, but more important are the technological advances which have wiped out many entry jobs formerly available to young people. The most significant solution of all is the Vocational Education Act of 1963. Institutions of higher learning are calling it "occupational education" and these programs are assuming the responsibility for technical training through two year problems of educating all young people to their full potential. Colleges and universities will provide more and better education on the semi-professional, technical, and skilled levels, better guidance and better teacher education in these fields.

It has been recommended by educational authorities that a program of parental education be started in vocational guidance, because, in spite of increasingly large numbers of guidance workers in our schools today, three fourths of all high school pupils go to their parents for career guidance.

We have 70% of high school pupils taking college prep courses; why, because far too much emphasis is being given to a four year college program. Vocational programs in high schools have small enrollments and not enough interest is shown in such classes.

In our technological society, the nation must have a system of education to prepare individuals for a new world of work. The national recognition of the real importance of vocational training is needed and is taking place. It is important that all pupils recognize this trend and do some good sound thinking regarding your future and the future of your country.

A few years ago some high school graduates and today some college graduates have the attitude of ambition brought out by the saying, "The world is my oyster". The idea that today oyster is served on the half-shell is erroneous. It isn't. It has to be opened, and that is a tricky proposition. It can lead to cuts and bruises. Even worse, it can lead to not getting the thing open at all. We would encourage each person to be productive, to contribute his fair share, and prepare to live in a society where automation exists and controls the world of work.
