TRIP DESTINATION: Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center, Dallas TX

PURPOSE/BENEFIT OF TRIP: VEX Robotics is the largest competitive robotics organization in the world. The VEX Robotics World Championship ("Worlds") collect the very top teams from each state and from countries around the word for a final, culminating tournament. In order to attend, teams must qualify first for their state or regional championship, and from there for Worlds. Cape Robotics has sent one or two teams to Worlds since at least 2010. This year, for the first time, we are sending three! The VEX World Championship is both a competition, held at the highest level, and an invaluable learning opportunity for students. VEX Robotics offers an unparalleled hands-on engineering experience for K-12 students, equipping them to pursue a wide range of STEM disciplines after they graduate.

TRANSPORTATION ARRANGEMENTS: Families are responsible for making flight and hotel reservations and other accommodations. VEX has made arrangements with Travel Team Source for assistance with booking, to arrange for low cost hotel stays, and so forth.

ARRANGEMENT FOR MIXED GENDER SUPERVISION: Families are responsible for making flight and hotel reservations and other accommodations. On this trip, each student will be accompanied by at least one parent. At the venue itself, supervision has historically been excellent. No additional provisions are deemed necessary.

COST PER STUDENT: Registration for the event is \$1200 per team. With three teams and a total of 10 participating students, this works out to be \$120 per student. CEHS and CEMS have already provided half the registration expenses, the rest coming from existing club funds. The

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reminder of the trip cost is to be supplied by fundraising.

DESCRIPTION OF ANY FUNDRAISING: The Cape Robotics boosters have estimated expenses above and beyond registration at about \$14000 and are underway raising necessary funds. Fundraising centers on solicited donations of local corporations. In exchange for a qualifying donation to Cape Robotics, corporations earn logo placement on banners (taken to Worlds) and tee shirts (worn at Worlds), as well as continued recognition in the following season. Additional fundraising activities such as bake sales, raffles, etc. are in discussion. Media outreach is also underway, providing community exposure to the team's successes and an opportunity to donate. Families understand that any shortfall in fundraising must be borne by families.
