At Whitefield Elementary School

WES will be ready to open on time and welcome Kindergarten through eighth grade students on the morning of Monday, April 19th. All of the current hybrid Kindergarten through eighth grade students will transition to five full days of in-person instruction and there will no longer be any remote days. A small percentage of fully remote students will be returning to the building to be part of this schedule as well. The office will be reaching out to those families to assist in the transition, letting them know who their child's teacher will be, and with information on a virtual orientation meeting to be held on the evening of Wednesday the 14th. WES will continue to support the remaining remote cohort with no interruption in schedule or personnel through the end of this year.

At the building, there will be no changes to the daily mitigation strategies. WES will still be fully masked, cohorted, and physical distance will continue to be maximized. They have made physical room changes to accommodate student numbers and ask that screening continue to be done at home prior to departure each morning with a second screening being done at school. Students who are experiencing symptoms at home should stay home and parents should call in to report the situation to Nurse Miller. Arrival and dismissal times and protocols remain the same. Lunch times and protocols will remain the same while Unified Arts and recess schedules have been adjusted to accommodate all students. As always, anyone with question is urged to reach out.
