CHS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Course Credit Requirements:

- ★ 20 credits for each: English, Mathematics and Physical Education/Health
- ★ 15 credits for each: Social Studies and Science
- ★ 5 credits of World Language
- ★ 5 credits of Visual and Performing Arts
- ★ 5 credits of 21st Century Life & Careers
- ★ 2.5 credits of Financial Literacy
- ★ Total: 130 credits needed for graduation!



CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR PROMOTION

The minimum number of credits needed to pass into selected grades is as follows:

- 10th Grade: 30 credits
- 11th grade: 65 credits
- 12th grade: 90 credits



GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) & COURSE LEVELS

- ★ Level I: All non-honors and non-AP courses
 - o GPA scale A: 4.0
- ★ Level II: Pre-AP or Honors courses
 - GPA scale A: 5.0
- ★ Level III: AP courses
 - GPA scale A: 5.5



★ GPA=Total Quality Points/ Total Credits Attempted

Quality points for each course are determined by multiplying the numerical grade weight of the final grade by the number of credits for that course

*Honors and AP courses are weighted and will appear in your cumulative GPA and class rank

ATTENDANCE

- ★ Any student who exceeds 12 unexcused absences will lose credit in all full-year courses; and a student who exceeds 6 unexcused absences in a given semester will lose credit in all semester courses.
- ★ One absence is equivalent to two (2) half day absences or five (5) tardies
- ★ Credit reinstatement will be available for students who have accumulated 13-27 days. Beyond that, lost credit can not be restored.



TEACHER COURSE RECOMMENDATIONS

★ Teachers have been asked to provide recommendations for students in all academic areas.



- These recommendations serve as guidelines for course selection
- ★ Counselors will meet with students individually to review selections and teacher recommendation
- ★ Students who have not been recommended for the Pre-AP, Honors, or AP level may waive into the course with a signed student/parent waiver.
- ★ PLEASE NOTE: Students who wish to drop a course they opted/waived into will need to verify that they have taken advantage of every support available before a course change will be considered.



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What do 4 year institutions look for?

- ★ You should be enrolled in honors or AP courses to attend a competitive four year college.
 - Your transcript should reflect the most rigorous course load in which you can be the most successful
- ★ Most four year institutions recommend the following:
 - Taking <u>at least</u> 2 consecutive years of the same foreign language
 - Continuing with Science/Social Studies classes into senior year
 - Longevity continue with courses in a specific program for as long as possible



NJSIAA & NCAA Eligibility



- ★ To be eligible for the fall and winter season, students must have earned 30 credits at the end of the summer for the preceding year.
 - All first time 9th graders are eligible in the fall season
- ★ To be eligible for the spring season, students must have earned 15 credits for the first semester

NCAA:

- ★ In order to be eligible to play Division I or Division II athletics in college, a student must meet certain academic requirements in high school as well as complete NCAA eligibility registration.
- ★ Ensure that your counselor is aware of your collegiate plans to make sure that you are placed in appropriate and approved courses.
