
Background Information

"Effective [April 28, 2021], districts and open-enrollment charter schools (school systems) in Texas may apply to receive their allocation of the \$11.2 billion appropriated to the State of Texas for public education purposes under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief III (ESSER III) Fund. Funds are being provided, supplemental to all other funding sources to school systems, and will not be supplanted at the state level. School systems should use these new funds to respond to the pandemic and to address student learning loss as a result of COVID-19."

Background Information

"The U.S. Department of Education's (USDE) initial grant award notice to **Texas makes immediately available two-thirds of the total federal appropriation to Texas** under ARP (ESSER III), and, as a result, TEA is providing that same amount to Texas schools. Most, but not all school systems, are eligible to receive funds under required federal funding formulas. **The remaining one-third of ARP (ESSER III) funds will be released to schools in the amounts indicated on the allocation document and will also be supplemental to all other state funds.** However, due to federal requirements, these funds have not yet been made available to the state and remain contingent upon USDE approving the state plan. The state plan will be developed in consultation with educators and other stakeholders around the state, as required by federal law."

TEM Status of ESSER Funds

- ESSER I funds have been fully obligated, with supplemental funding provided with CRF
- ESSER III formula funds are being released today as supplemental funds
 - 2/3rds of ESSER III made available for districts.
- ESSER II will be released pending legislative resolution

Blue Ridge ISD received \$60,047

ESSER I allowed funds to be used for purchases made to continue instruction during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- graphing calculators for BRMS and BRHS students; and
- Edmentum Courseware (BRHS asynchronous learning) and Study Island (online targeted interventions on each campus)






Reading Development Timeline







BRE K-2 IStation Data




Blue Ridge Elementary IStation - February 2019 - 2021

Learning Acceleration Framework	Potential Uses of Funds
Supported Teachers	 Professional Development: comprehensive Reading Academies, dyslexia training, professional development stipends, technology integration training Staffing: tutors, reduced class sizes, small group instruction, staff retention and recruitment incentive pay, after school enrichment programs, instructional coaching and leadership Mental Health and Behavioral Supports: teacher training and programming
Rigorous Instructional Materials	 Materials, Technology, and Training: Instructional materials to help address areas of need for COVID learning loss, learning management systems, training on materials and LMS
More Time	 Extended Instructional Time: extended day, extended year, high-dosage tutoring, summer learning
Empower Parents	 Mental Health and Behavioral Supports: social workers, At-risk coordinators, additional counseling services, wrap-around and community partnerships
