Dear Marston Families,



When we return from the spring break, we are officially in the home-stretch of the school year! During this time, we will continue to participate in engaging learning activities, enjoy the dining room, take our learning outside, attend field trips and extended learning opportunities, and participate in state assessments. We kindly ask that you spend some time reinforcing appropriate school behavior as we strive to maintain an academic focus until the very last day of school. Teachers will be in touch regarding their specific schedules for these state-wide assessments. On assessment days, it is important for students to eat a good breakfast, arrive to school on time, and get a good night's sleep. Your support and your child's attendance positively impact these benchmark tests. If you have any questions regarding them, please feel free to contact your child's teacher or one of us. Results will be sent home as soon as they are available.

All students who have read 100 books or more will receive a special t-shirt and will be honored at our school wide morning meeting on the last day of school.
