There continues to be legislative changes that impact laws, policies, and practices. These changes are reviewed at sub-committee meetings, vetted by lawyers, and then voted on by the school board. Some of these policies are considered priority and are required by law. One that we felt should be brought to your attention is Policy GBCD: Background Investigation and Criminal History Records. Under this updated policy, all "Designated Volunteers" must be fingerprinted for a history of records and background review. A "Designated Volunteer" is any volunteer who:

- a) Comes in direct contact with students on a predictable basis
- b) Meets regularly with students
- c) Meets with students on a one-on-one basis
- d) Any other volunteer so designated by the School Board or Superintendent
