We appreciate your partnership as we continue to work together on our students' behalf.

Students continue to participate in end of year assessments. These are used to monitor student progress and to inform our instructional programs. Remember for students to perform at their best, it is important for students to get a good night's sleep, eat a healthy breakfast, and arrive to school on time. Your support and attention to this matter is greatly appreciated.

This morning, I attended the New Hampshire School Administrators Association monthly meeting. During that time, Jennifer Graham from the Governor's Youth Advisory Council on Substance Misuse and Prevention reviewed New Hampshire's statewide campaign, "No Safe Experience." This is specifically aimed at middle school and high school students and families. Focus is around awareness and education. They specifically shared that fentanyl is, unfortunately here in our state and impacting many of our children and families.
