## **Program Compliance**

Annually, on or before October 1, the superintendent will determine if the district complies with the following program requirements:

- A. Appropriate measures are taken to safeguard all student and school district permanent records against loss or damage;
- B. Provision is made for the supervision of instructional practices and procedures;
- C. Current basic instructional materials are available for required courses of study;
- D. A program of guidance, counseling, and testing services is maintained for students in all grades offered by the school district;
- E. A learning resources program is maintained;
- F. The physical facilities of each building are adequate and appropriate for the educational program offered;
- G. There is adequate provision for the health and safety of all students within the custody of the school district;
- H. A current policy statement about the administration and operation of the school district is available online or in each building's administrative office, including, but not limited to, policies governing the school building and classroom visitation rights of non-students;
- I. The district complies with the statutes that prohibit unequal treatment of individuals based on race, sex, creed, color, honorably discharged veteran, sexual orientation, presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, or the use of a trained guide dog or service animal by a person with a disability and national origin in activities supported by common schools and which require equal access to Boy Scouts of America and other designated youth groups;
- J. The school principal has determined that appropriate student discipline is established and enforced within each school. The school principal has conferred with the certificated employees in the school building to develop and/or review building disciplinary standards and the uniform enforcement of those standards;
- K. The school district board of directors has adopted written high school graduation requirements and rules; and
- L. Equivalence among schools in teachers, administrators, and auxiliary personnel and equivalence in providing curriculum materials and supplies among schools that receive Title 1 funds.
