Affordable Connectivity Program

What is the Affordable Connectivity Program?

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) replaces, expands, and makes permanent the FCC temporary Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program, which helped low-income households afford internet service during the pandemic. ACP will help ensure that eligible households can continue to afford internet connections needed for school, work, health care, and more. The program includes:

- \$30/month for broadband services for eligible households
- \$75/month for households on qualifying tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider (discount is not available through ACP if you received it under the EBB program)

Who is eligible to receive the ACP benefit?

A household is eligible if one member of the household:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline
- Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income program
