Continental School to Receive Two New Scholarship Opportunities for Students

Michael Walls Endowment Scholarship

Michael Walls graduated from Continental High School with the Class of 1960. Mike was active in sports, drama, and was Class President. School was a sanctuary for him and he appreciated the personal caring and attention that the teachers provided. He was encouraged and supported by many, including the former superintendent's secretary, Lillian McKibben.

Mike was inspired by the teachers and the positive effect that they could have on the lives of students and was motivated to become an educator himself. He began teaching in 1965 and later earned a Master's Degree and a PhD in Educational Leadership. He became a Principal in 1968 and became the Superintendent of Schools in Beloit, Wisconsin in 1979 and Wilmington, Delaware in 1985. He takes pride in recognizing that the quality education at Continental encouraged many graduates over the years to become school administrators...Dick Kirkendall, Larry Bracken, Darwin Ziegler, Jim Grant, the Jones boys, and Gary Dowler, to name a few.

Mike was recognized by the Beloit Chamber of Commerce with its First Citizen Award in 1970 and was recognized by Executive Educator as one of America's Best 100 Superintendents in 1990. The Delaware State Board of Education presented him with the Outstanding Achievement Medal in 1989.

He appreciates that he has been incredibly fortunate and believes strongly in paying it forward. He has provided a scholarship for a graduating senior at CHS since 1992 and is presently endowing a scholarship through Bowling Green State University for a Continental High School graduate who will attend BGSU. Besides the Continental Endowment, he has endowed four other scholarships, three at Adrian College and one at the University of Michigan.

Mike continues to be involved in educational ventures today and is presently Chair of the Board of IM4U Learning, IM4U Learning was founded and created by Jim Mayer, the bass player in Jimmy Buffett's Coral Reefer Band. Mike is also a Strategic Advisor to Mindfulness Matters, a program based on the principles of meditation to bring calm and harmony to the stressful lives of teachers.

He credits the professionalism and commitment of the teachers at CHS in providing him with a foundation for what success he has had in life.

This year's first recipient of the Dr. Michael Walls Endowment Scholarship, and receiving \$1,000, is Andrew Hoeffel son of Chris Hoeffel and Annette Hoeffel. Andrew plans to attend BGSU and aspires to become a history teacher.





Some statistics of interest for the Class of 2022: out of 39 graduating seniors, 17 or 46% plan to enter the workforce (most have full-time employment already lined up); 21 or 54% have plans to attend college (either at a 4-year university or a 2-year community college); and one will be entering the military. Time to Immunize



JH/HS Immunizations Required for 2022/2023 School Year

According to the Ohio Department of Health rules for the 2022-2023 school year, students entering as:

7th graders are required to have one dose of both a Tdap and Meningitis (MCV\$) vaccine.

12th Graders are required to have one or two doses of the Meningitis (MVV4) vaccine.

A Tdap vaccine protects against three diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis.

The MCV4 vaccine protects against four strains of Meningitis (A, C, W, Y).

Please consider scheduling an appointment early in the summer to avoid the back to school rush. August is typically a busy time when many parents are getting their children up to date on their vaccinations before the school year starts. Appointments can be scheduled by calling the Putnam County Health Department at 419-523-5608. Area pharmacies and medical offices also provide the vaccines. Please send a copy of your child's immunization record to the high school office or have your student present it on their first day of school.


