It is with great pride that I welcome you to the 2018-2019 school year. Whether you are new to the district or returning, I want you to know that your children are in the capable hands of highly-focused educators committed to make Meridian Public Schools the most progressive and successful school district in the Great Lakes Bay Region. Like all successful organizations, we are always working to improve and better serve our students and families. We continue with our mission of preparing students for life, college and careers in the 21st Century by focusing on the skills and training needed to be successful. The faculty and staff return from their summer of coursework and professional development ready to welcome students and eager to get started.

- Finalize your college list: Narrow your list to 5-8 schools. Get an application and financial aid information for each. **Note all application deadlines!**
- <u>Visit</u> prospective colleges if you haven't already. —If you wish to take the ACT, register by September 28th for the October 27th test date. If you wish to retake the SAT, register by September 7th for the October 6th test date.
- Determine who you would like to write letters of recommendation for you and <u>ask early</u>.
- Start working on your college application essay. It's a crucial part of your application.
- Complete your applications before the deadlines arrive. —Check with Mrs. Boxey, or Ms. Kasper (juniors & seniors) or Mrs. Wenzlick (5th year) if you have any questions.
- Complete your FAFSA beginning October 1st so you can get the
 most financial aid possible for college (Deadline for completing the
 FASFA is March 1st, 2019). Meridian will hold a Financial Aid
 Night in November. Watch announcements for the specific
 date.
- Explore your prospective schools' financial aid requirements to plan your college budget.



Requirements to pick up student's laptop

- Must register their student for the 2018-2019 school year in Skyward.
- Laptop insurance must be paid, this can be done ahead of time on eFunds or can pay at time of laptop pickup.
- If student is younger than 18 years of age, a parent or guardian must be present to pickup the laptop.
- Laptop insurance for the first student in family is \$75, for the second it is \$50, and for every student after that it is \$25. The cost for families that qualify for free and reduced status is \$50 for the first student, \$25 for the second, and \$25 for every student after.

Parent Loop / Parking Lot Safety

To avoid bus traffic, MJHS parents have an area to drop off students before school starts and pick up students at the end of the school day. The Parent Loop is located on the east side of the building.

- Students can be dropped off at the south/east doors between **7:40** a.m. and **7:55** a.m. Students dropped off after 7:55 a.m. will need to enter MJHS at the main entrance.
- Parents picking up students at the end of the school day can line up around the loop to wait for their child to be dismissed at 2:55 p.m.
- Parents picking up students **prior** to the end of the school day will have to sign their child out in the main office. Please note that visitor cars need to be removed from the parking lot in front of the main entrance before 2:50 p.m. due to the lining up of buses.
- Parents picking up both elementary and middle school students are still welcome to park in the administration or elementary parking lots. While the buses are lined up for dismissal, middle school students getting picked up in either of these parking lots will be allowed to walk in the cross-walk behind the last bus to reach their parents as safely as possible.
- If you remember one thing, parents, please DO NOT drive by the buses when they are lined up in front of MJHS.
- At the end of the school day, students are expected to get on the bus at MJHS unless being picked up by a parent. Students should NOT walk from MJHS to the elementary to catch their bus.
- Finally, please be patient and drive slowly whenever you are on campus. Let's have a safe year for our children.

For the upcoming school year, there are some items that will need your attention. Some of them are:

- **E-funds** is the online payment system that is available for food service and child care payments. Access can be found at www.merps.org or by downloading the Meridian app that connects to our new website by searching "Meridian Public Schools, MI" in the app store. Click Menu at the top and select the Food and Nutrition page under the Departments dropdown list.
- Free and reduced applications need to be filled out each school year. Status from the previous year extends until October 15, **2018,** at which time if a current application is not received, student status will go back to full pay, and you will be responsible for those charges.
- **On-line applications** are also available on our new website at www.merps.org or after you have downloaded the "Meridian Public Schools, MI" app and can be found under the Free and Reduced Meals section on the Food and Nutrition page. Look for LunchApp.com to submit. Paper applications are available in all buildings if your family has not received one in the mail already.
- Breakfast is still free to all students in all buildings. Please encourage students to take advantage of this.
- High School scheduling remains the same with one lunch period. Don't forget we have a 2nd chance breakfast opportunity also, and that will be available after 1st period for about 10 minutes.
- Nutrislice is a new program that is available to you and your student that analyzes the nutritional information of each item we serve, including allergies, and carb information and is also available on the Food and Nutrition department page.

2018-2019 School Year Full Meal Prices

There will be no increase in meal prices for this school year.

We have seen a dramatic rise in food prices and will continue to do so over the next few years due to increasing transportation costs and continuing new meal legislative requirements but prices, as determined by Meridian Public Schools leadership, will remain the same once again.

Breakfast is free at Meridian Early Childhood Center, Meridian Elementary School, Meridian Junior High School, and Meridian Early College High School ***(with new requirements met)***

Elementary and Early Childhood Center lunch prices: All \$2.75 Junior High and High School lunch prices: \$3.00 for Type A-the bowl meals and sandwich meals \$3.15 for Type B-the pizza and sub/wrap meals

Reduced status meals will remain at \$.40 All Adult meals are \$3.75 Milk is available with all meals. All 8 oz. cartons are \$.50.

Our menus will be posted online also, weekly for the secondary buildings and monthly for the elementary. Our new charge policy, implemented a couple of years ago is also posted. Any student that is not picked up and dropped off at home must have a properly completed transportation form turned into transportation BEFORE AUGUST 28th to be considered. Transportation Handbook Highlights

See below for a list of highlights from our handbook that we are focusing on to enhance the transportation operations beginning September 2018. Each household or family should have received the complete handbook in the mail already but if you haven't, they are available in every school office or on the website at www.merps.org by clicking Menu and selecting Transportation from the Departments dropdown list.

- Buses shall be visible in all traffic directions when stopped, and stops shall be at least 200 feet apart.
- Students should arrive at the bus stop five minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus.
- If a student is the only one assigned to a particular bus stop and
 the student will be absent for ten (10) consecutive days, the bus
 will not stop again until the parent/guardian calls to resume
 transportation.
- Parents/Guardians are requested to identify one (1) pick up and one (1) drop off location for the school year. Exceptions are joint custody and Sanford Elementary Latch key program before and after school. The bus stop may or may not be located at the students' home address. Parents are responsible to ensure the student is met at the designated stop by a responsible person if required.
- Changes to the scheduled transportation for a student also may be made upon written request at least 72 hours in advance from the parent/guardian. Direct your changes to Meridian Transportation Office. All forms are available on-line or at the school office. The Transportation request must include your student's name and destination and be signed by a parent/guardian. School personnel, upon receipt of your written request, will authorize your request and/or complete a bus pass that will be given to the driver.

Meridian Public School will no longer accept notes handed to the driver or phone calls from parents/guardians, only properly completed forms turned into the Transportation office 72 hours in advance of the change in transportation.
