Welcome to Spanish IV Class with Mrs. Reynolds!! I'm looking forward to working with you this year and continue your learning process of the Spanish language. Please read through the course description, materials, grading and policies.

## ➤ Course description

In Spanish IV students will continue to work in the skills learned in Spanish I, II and III: reading, writing, listening, speaking and culture. Themes and topics will expand and students will be using old and learning new vocabulary and grammar. New vocabulary includes: traveling, professions, around the city, camping, health and shopping. Regular and irregular verbs will be used in more advanced tenses such as subjunctive, future, and conditional. will learn to read, understand, analyze and summarize basic, Spanish/Hispanic literature. They will be able to write more complex paragraphs and sentences, as well as simple essays and stories. They will perform oral presentations, skits, advertisements etc. This class will be conducted in Spanish primarily.
