





<u>Chromebooks:</u> All students will be provided a Chromebook at the beginning of the school year for their use at home and school. Students and parents will be required to electronically sign the form in FinalForms indicating they have read and understand the 1:1 agreement, as well as pay a \$30 non-refundable insurance cost before picking up the Chromebook.

Chromebook Pick-Up Date: Wednesday, August 9, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the high school large group room. FINALFORMS MUST BE COMPLETED IN ORDER TO PICK UP CHROMEBOOKS.

Student Schedules: Students will receive their schedule online through Progressbook on August 7.

Schedule Changes: Students will have the opportunity to meet with their guidance counselor about schedule changes on Wednesday, August 9, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. If this date and times do not work, students can email their guidance counselor to schedule a different meeting time.

<u>FinalForms:</u> Information was sent out about this new one-stop location for parents to connect with the school and update their information. Please fill out all electronic forms: www.finalforms.com. Forms that need to be completed prior to the beginning of the school year are Emergency Medical Forms, Free and Reduced Lunch Forms, and Transportation forms (if applicable).

School Pictures: Will be held at the high school on Thursday, August 24, for grades 8 through 12. Picture re-takes will take place on Friday, October 13.

<u>Homecoming:</u> The homecoming football game will be played on Friday, September 29. The Homecoming Dance will be held the following evening, Saturday, September 30.

<u>Fall ACT Dates:</u> Saturday, September 9, and October 28. If your child plans to take one of these tests at WHS, or at another testing site, they should register at <u>www.act.org.</u>

<u>Get Involved:</u> We want to encourage all our students to get involved in extracurricular activities that are happening at the high school. There are many teams, clubs, and groups that our students can join. We believe that students will have a better high school experience if they take the initiative to get involved!

Other Important Information: At WHS there is no set class supply list. However, we would recommend that you purchase pens, pencils, loose paper, 6-7 folders, 2-3 three-ring binders, a few spiral notebooks that you can tear paper out of, and any other items that you feel you need to start school. We also recommend you have a pair of headphones available for use with the Chromebooks. On the first day of school, your teachers will share with you the specific items you will need for that particular class, but it shouldn't involve much more than what is listed above. If you have specific questions, please call the High School office.

Our Math Department recommends purchasing a graphing calculator for Algebra classes and higher. Look for back-to-school specials in August. A recommended calculator to purchase is the TI-84 Plus CE. Please save the TI Points that are on the back of the package and give them to your math teacher.

All school fees for the 2023-24 school year will be due by October 13, 2023. This will allow the approval/denial process for free or reduced fees to be completed before fees are collected. Parents/Guardians who will not be applying for free or reduced fees may pay school fees prior to October 13.

Students may qualify to have their 2023-24 academic fees waived or reduced by sixty percent (60%). To apply for free or reduced fees, you must fill out a free and reduced lunch form. You may apply in FinalForms by logging into your parent account, or obtain a paper form from the school's website or any school office. Fines assessed for damages to materials, library books, etc., will not be reduced or waived.

REMEMBER: Student fees can be paid on-line at www.myschoolBucks.com. A small transaction fee will apply. If you wish to pay on-line and you need further assistance, please contact Angie Sparks, Treasurer, at 419-739-2900.

Non-discrimination Policy

Every Student Succeeds Act

You have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of your child's classroom teacher or paraeducator in a school receiving Title I funds. The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Section 1111(h)(6)(A) requires that any local school district receiving Title I funds must notify parents that they may ask about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher.

These qualifications include:

- 1. Whether the teacher has met the Ohio teacher licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides your child instruction.
- 2. Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or temporary status that waives state licensing requirements.
- 3. The undergraduate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate degree or certification (such as National Board Certification) held by the teacher and the field of discipline of certification or degree.
- 4. Whether your child is provided services by instructional paraeducators and, if so, their qualifications. You may request the information by fax (419-739-2918) or email (schnch@wapak.org). Be sure to give the following information: child's full name; parent/guardian's full name; address including city, state, zip; and teacher's name. Parents and community members may also request information regarding curricular materials and programming at any of the school buildings.

Parent Involvement

Parents play an important role in the education of their children. We encourage parents to become involved in the parent-teacher team, support volunteer programs, and partner with the school in developing a cooperative relationship between school and home. The Every Student Succeeds Act states that students with involved parents are more likely to earn higher grades and test scores, pass their classes, be promoted, attend school regularly, and graduate and go on to postsecondary education. The Wapakoneta City Schools Board of Education (policy 2261.01) encourages parent participation. Please contact your building principal to see how you can become more involved.
