

We preview the text first by reading the questions, then predicting what we're going to read by looking at the title and any other features there might be. While taking the test,

we practiced looking back in the passage to find the answer, or find support for our answers.



Concepts in Science

4th Grade- Students will construct an explanation about how patterns are used to transmit information

5th Grade-Students will plan and carry out investigations to describe the movement of matter among plants, animals, decomposers, and the environment.

6th Grade- Students explore how different systems interact to enable structural and supportive body functions. They learn how these interacting systems enable movement, and support or refute that the body could not function without the support of the skeletal system.





Early Intensive Behavioral Intervention: For children who are younger than 5 years old, this therapy helps build positive behavior and reduce unwanted behavior. Therapy sessions are one-on-one with a trained therapist.
