I hope this letter finds you well and you and your family are as excited about returning to school as we are. I wanted to send out a quick message today to welcome you back to school and point to where you may find any information or assistance you may need as you prepare to return.

For starters I always like to recap the summer and send out a few congratulations. This summer we had literally hundreds of students participate in some form of summer learning. Several hundred students participated in the on-line Spartan Summer Success Academy, over 100 students participated in face to face summer school at Lake Forest High School, Central Elementary School hosted an extended school year program, and about 80 students participated in high dosage tutoring. East Elementary School and WT Chipman also hosted summer school opportunities. Congratulations to all the students and families who took part in summer learning and thank you to the many staff members who supported them.

Next, I want to share the good news that both the Federal and State governments have lifted all limitations for returning to school. This means we are free from the restrictions which were prompted by the pandemic and were in place during the previous three school years. On behalf of everyone here in Lake Forest, I want to thank you for your cooperation over the past three school years as I know it has not been easy. What this means is we are back to the business of expecting all students are in school every day unless they are personally ill or experiencing symptoms. We know that every child has the potential to succeed at the highest level and this year we intend to push our expectations to help every child get the most out of their experience here in Lake Forest. Tuesday, September 13 No school for students for Election Day


Saturday, October 1 I Love Lake Forest Day at Lake Forest High School
