Greetings SATEC Families,

We hope everyone is enjoying this wonderful summer! We are writing to welcome you and your child/children to the start of the school year and to provide you with some general information and dates.

We would like to thank all the staff who worked the month of July to make our Summer Program a huge success! We also thank our Farm to School coordinator, Stina Booth, and our volunteers for their help with our gardens. We thank our entire custodial team for their efforts keeping the building clean and working on projects to keep our school a beautiful place to learn! Flooring has been replaced in both the 4th grade and 8th grade classrooms. In addition, CS (5th grade) also has new flooring and classrooms have been enclosed with new walls and doors.

Our District and school goals for the 2023-2024 year will focus on improving student attendance, participation, and engagement as well as improving student literacy and math scores. Our hope is that each student will not have more than 9 absences for the entire school year and for every child to make improvements in their literacy and math skills. When we look at national, state and local student achievement data between 30-40 percent of students are on grade level in literacy and math. Our District has set a goal for over 50% of our students to be performing on grade level by the end of the school year.

We will be continuing with our early release day every Wednesday. Wednesday dismissal will begin at 2:00pm with buses leaving by 2:15. Staff work on these days will be focused on the three main areas of our MRUSD Recovery plan: literacy, math, and school climate (attendance and student participation). The work will involve collaborating to improve student learning, social emotional support, reviewing student performance data, and planning instructional practices to meet our student goals.

We are looking forward to the upcoming school year and the many opportunities that exist for our students to grow and be engaged in their learning. Let us know if there is anything we can do to improve your child's learning experience while here at SATEC. We appreciate your continued support and look forward to a great year working with you and your child/children!

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Health Information:

STAY HOME WHEN SICK. THIS MEANS WHEN STUDENTS:

- *Have a fever (temperature greater than 100.3 F)**Students must be fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
- *Uncontrolled cough or difficulty breathing
- *Vomiting or persistent diarrhea. **Students must be vomiting and diarrhea free for 24 hours before returning to school.
- *Severe headache, especially if accompanied by a fever.
- *Skin rash when accompanied by fever.
- *Continue good hygiene practices by regular hand washing and use of hand sanitizer.

Health office will be open for medicine drop offs on 8/24 1:30-3:30 or 8/25 1:30-3:30. If other arrangements need to be made please contact the health office. PreK-4 802-752-2685 or grades 5-8, 802-752-2705.

PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION FORM:

If your child needs to take prescription medication while in school, you need to complete the appropriate form on the first day of school. This authorization must be on file at school in order for your child to receive such medications. If you have questions, please call the School Nurse's office PreK-grade 4 752-2685. Grades 5-8 can be reached at 752-2705.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:

The first day of school for students in grades PK-8 will be held on Wednesday, August 30th. This will be a full day of school for students in grades K-8. Our first early release day will also be 8/30 with dismissal starting 2:00pm. We will be sending home a variety of materials on the first day of school, which will include: Student Information Verification Form, Abbey Group information, free and reduced lunch applications, health office forms, and the Student/Parent Handbook.

DROP OFF in AM 8:10-8:25:

All students will be welcome in their classrooms at 8:15am. We will begin the morning drop off at 8:10am. Students who enter the building between 8:10-8:15 will wait in the cafeteria until they can go to their classrooms at 8:15am. Please do not drop students off earlier than 8:10am. Parent drop off is between 8:10-8:25am in the front of the school. Buses will unload in the back each morning. Students will be considered tardy if they arrive in their classrooms after 8:25am.

Parent Notification System - BrightArrow:

This is a notification service that allows us to send telephone and e-mail messages to you providing important information about school events or emergencies. We will continue to use this service this year. Information about how the service works can be found in the Parent/Student Handbook.

CELL PHONES and Student technology purchased from home:

1. SATEC does not want outside technology brought into school at any time (i.e. cell phones, apple watches, ipads or personal computers). These devices cause significant distraction to children's learning and can cause harm if used inappropriately. If a family needs a child to communicate with afterschool, we will ask that the cell phone/device be locked up with the homeroom teacher each morning for the duration of the day.
2. We are asking that parents and guardians have a means of monitoring all cell phone and technology use of their children. Parents are legally responsible for the actions of their children while using technology. Many outside of school activities between students online can become negative and cause problems in school. Monitoring your child's use of technology is extremely helpful.

HEALTH OFFICE INFORMATION

PLEASE KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL IF THEY HAVE THE FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS:

- Temperature OVER 100.3 degrees Fahrenheit. ** Students must be fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
- Uncontrolled cough or difficulty breathing
- Vomiting or persistent diarrhea. ** Students must be vomiting and diarrhea free for 24 hours before returning to school.
- Severe headache, especially if accompanied by a fever
- Skin rash when accompanied by a fever

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD BECOMES ILL AT SCHOOL?

Parents will be notified if their child becomes ill while at school. If contact can not be made with parents/guardians, the Nurse and School personnel will decide on a course of action. Students who need to be sent home for illness WILL NEED to be seen through the health office and dismissed from there.

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD NEEDS MEDICATION AT SCHOOL?

- **ALL MEDICATION, PRESCRIPTION OR OVER THE COUNTER** (including cough drops, eye drops, nasal sprays, antacids) **MUST BE DROPPED OFF AT THE THE SCHOOL BY AN ADULT AND GIVEN TO A HEALTH OFFICE STAFF MEMBER. NO MEDICATION OF ANY KIND CAN BE SENT IN WITH A STUDENT.**
- All prescription medication that needs to be given at school requires permission to be administered by Health Office staff AND a medication order from the Prescriber/Doctor. ** Please contact the prescriber for a medication order and ask them to fax or email it to our office. Fax 802-527-7043
- All over the counter medication that needs to be given at school will need permission from a parent or guardian. The Health office does keep some over the counter medications on hand for student use. Parent/guardian permission is required and is included on the yearly health form - contact the health office for an Annual Health Form if you don't have one
- Medications can be dropped off at school between the hours of 7:45-3:30.
