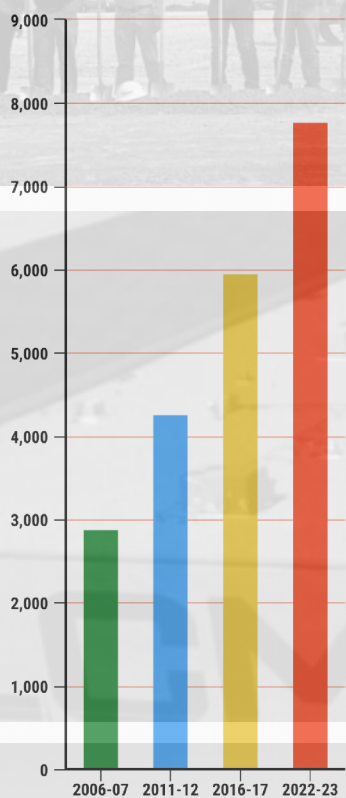

Student Enrollment at Lubbock-Cooper ISD



2006-07 2,881 students

Fifteen years ago, the student population of Lubbock-Cooper ISD was 2,881 - approximately one third of today's enrollment.

2011-12 4,259 students

During the 2011-12 school year, 4,259 students were enrolled in Lubbock-Cooper ISD - just over half of today's enrollment.

2016-17 5,956 students

The 2016-17 school year experienced continued growth, boasting 40% more students than just five years earlier.

2022-23 7,781 students

As of August 2022, there are 7,781 Pirates filling the halls of LCISD!

Enrollment

The Lubbock-Cooper community is booming, residentially and commercially. With each new door front comes an average of 0.52 new enrollees. With a current enrollment of approximately 7,600, the district grew by more than 250 students over Summer 2021, and has grown by an additional 250 in the Fall 2021 semester alone. LCISD has been among the top ten fastest growing schools in the state for the past decade.

Construction

We believe students deserve a safe, comfortable, welcoming learning environment. In order to accommodate the needs of our growing student population, LCISD has proactively constructed and renovated a number of campuses. In May 2021, Lubbock-Cooper voters passed a \$420 million bond (the largest in school history) to construct a second high school, third middle school, and sixth elementary school, in addition to a number of renovations. The May 2021 bond came with no tax rate increase.

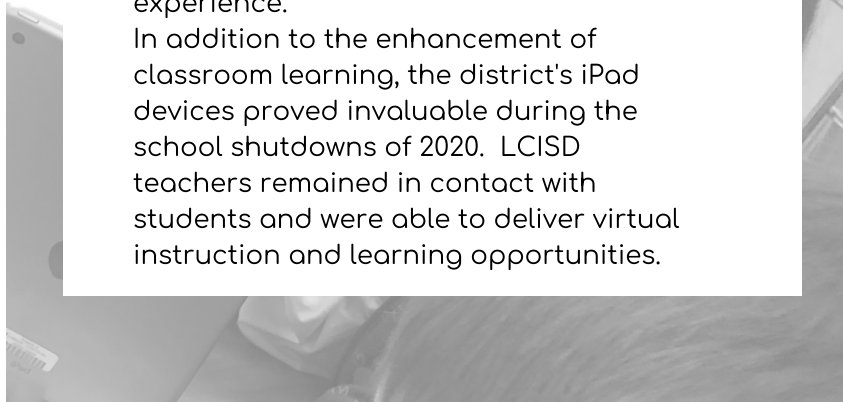


SAiL

In Fall 2019, LCISD implemented a one-to-one device initiative, placing district-issued iPads into the hands of all Lubbock-Cooper students from pre-k through 12th grade.

The one-to-one device program, the "SAiL Initiative," addresses students' unique learning styles and embraces their technology-infused reality. By providing students with contemporary technology resources, SAiL grants students ownership of their educational experience.

In addition to the enhancement of classroom learning, the district's iPad devices proved invaluable during the school shutdowns of 2020. LCISD teachers remained in contact with students and were able to deliver virtual instruction and learning opportunities.



Tech Resources

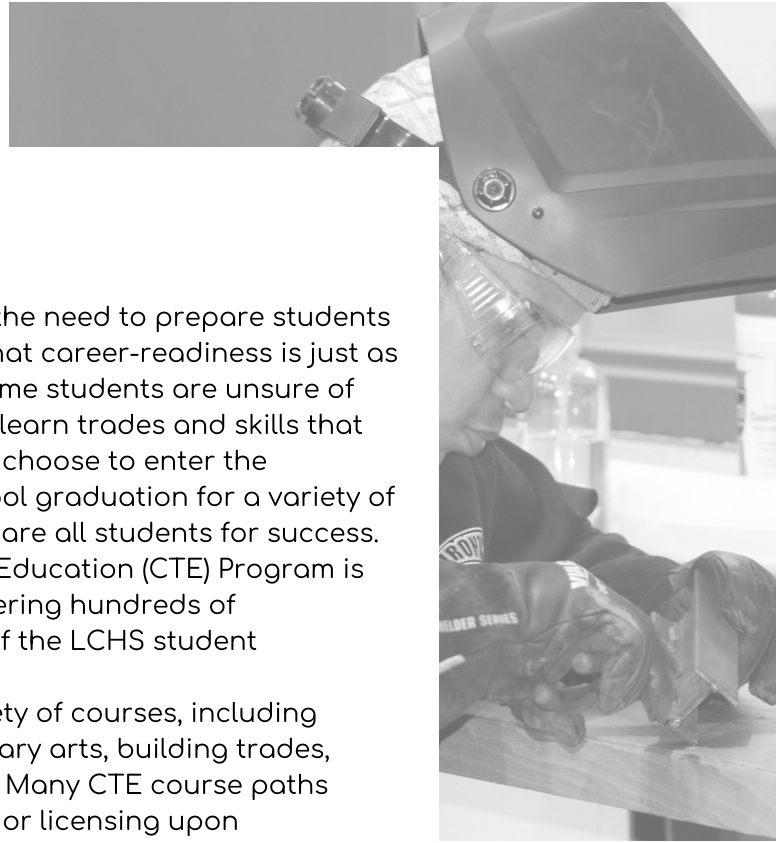
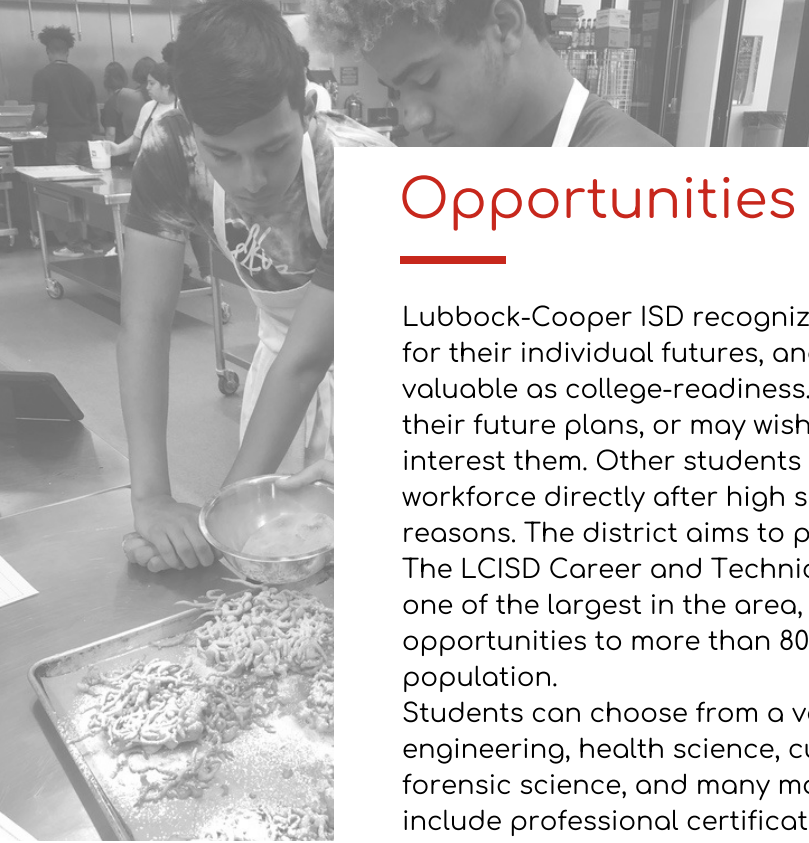

The district's Technology Department also curates a digital learning website featuring information tailored to educators and guardians regarding cutting edge technologies and responsible technology use.



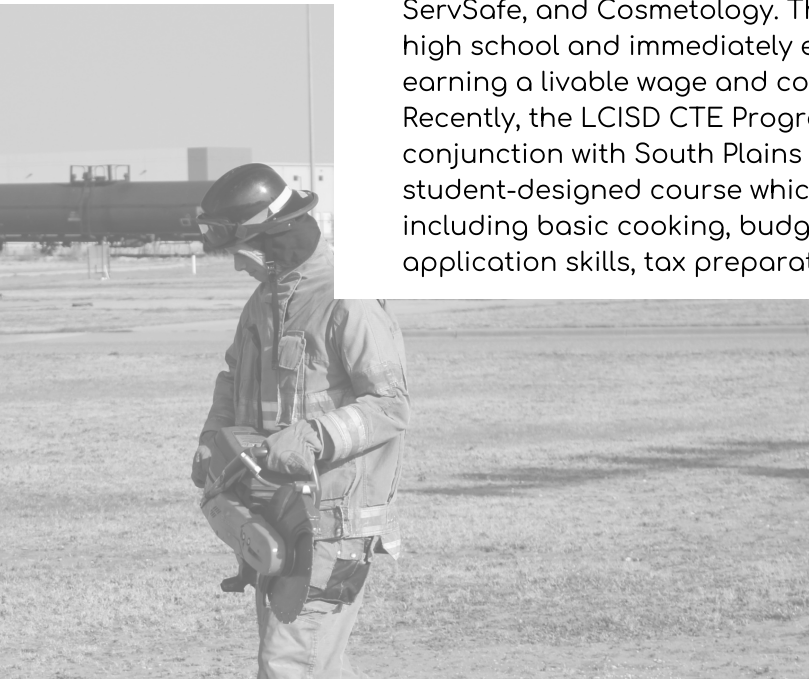
DISTRICT *CTE Program*



Opportunities

Lubbock-Cooper ISD recognizes the need to prepare students for their individual futures, and that career-readiness is just as valuable as college-readiness. Some students are unsure of their future plans, or may wish to learn trades and skills that interest them. Other students will choose to enter the workforce directly after high school graduation for a variety of reasons. The district aims to prepare all students for success. The LCISD Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program is one of the largest in the area, offering hundreds of opportunities to more than 80% of the LCHS student population.

Students can choose from a variety of courses, including engineering, health science, culinary arts, building trades, forensic science, and many more. Many CTE course paths include professional certification or licensing upon completion, including AutoTech, Adobe, OSHA, Welding, ServSafe, and Cosmetology. This allows students to graduate high school and immediately enter their chosen industry, earning a livable wage and contributing to the workforce. Recently, the LCISD CTE Program has added a Fire Academy (in conjunction with South Plains College) and Adulting 101, a student-designed course which teaches important life skills including basic cooking, budgeting, car maintenance, job application skills, tax preparation, and more.

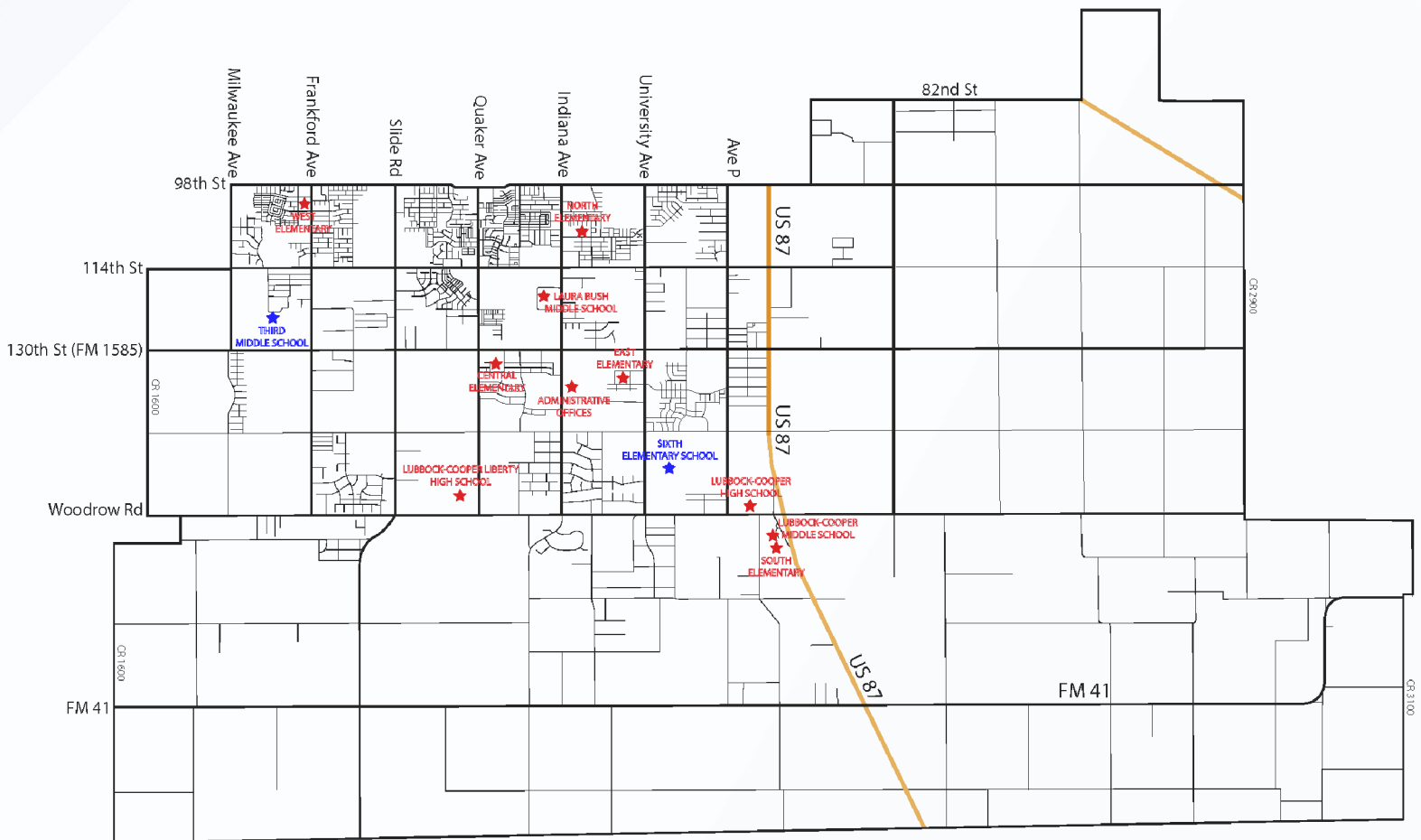
