WHS CAREER FAIR A HUGE SUCCESS!

In April, WHS held a job fair for their students.

- 683 students attended
- 58 companies/employers had booths at the job fair
- 277 students worked on their resumes
- According to a student survey, 55% of students said they found a job that they would want to apply for.

- FCI Constructors, Inc. has attended our job fair every year and attends community and college job fairs frequently. The FCI guys commented that this is the best job fair they've been to and that our high school students interact with employers/vendors better than many college students, that our students were engaged and professional!
- The McDonald's manager said she handed out 100 applications and one of the daycares printed 25 applications and needed more after the first 45 minutes!
- The City of Williston filled 4 positions by 12:00 on Friday - roads and general maintenance jobs!
- Cherry Creek Media is interested in interviewing 7 students for a news stringer job!
- 277 students worked on their resumes
