Sam Moser went over the building plans for the McMinn County High School Performance Center.

Director Parkison explained that as of August 8, 2022, there is \$350,224 from the Booster Club and they had been raising that money since June 16, 2016. He said there are a lot of avenues to help with the Performance Center Funding, and the reason for this meeting was for the MCBOE to decide on how much they are willing to help. Director Parkison said he spoke with Mayor Gentry about the Capital Improvement Fund, and the system is in good shape there, and Mayor Gentry would be happy to work with the system on the existing part, which is what Capital Improvement is for. He said Mr. Pratt is also still there, several people had heard him say he was willing to go to a certain amount, but he had not spoken with him since they just got the bid straightened out. He said Mr. Luallen told him there is some ARP money, \$448,000, and the system would have to make a request to the County Commission to use this money which has a deadline to be used or it is gone. Director Parkison said if the ARP money does not come through, it could possibly be taken out of Capital Improvement or Undesignated Funds and there is also sales tax money.

Mr. Heath Frazier talked about some of the current and upcoming school building projects. Mike Cochran asked Mr. Frazier if he could get a list together of capital projects for this school year to present to the board at the next meeting.
