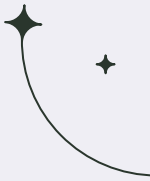



The process of curriculum review from our wide cast to the pilot choices.

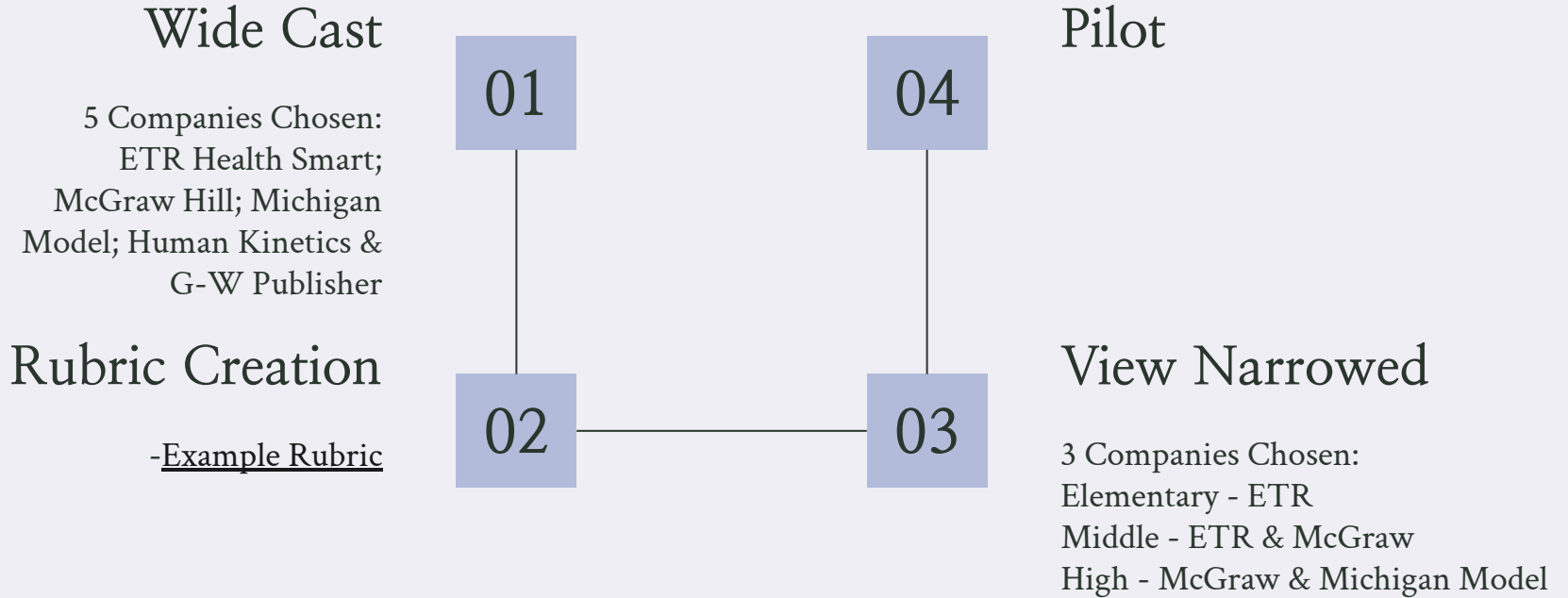


Step 3: Pilot

The process of conducting pilot lessons in elementary, middle and high schools.

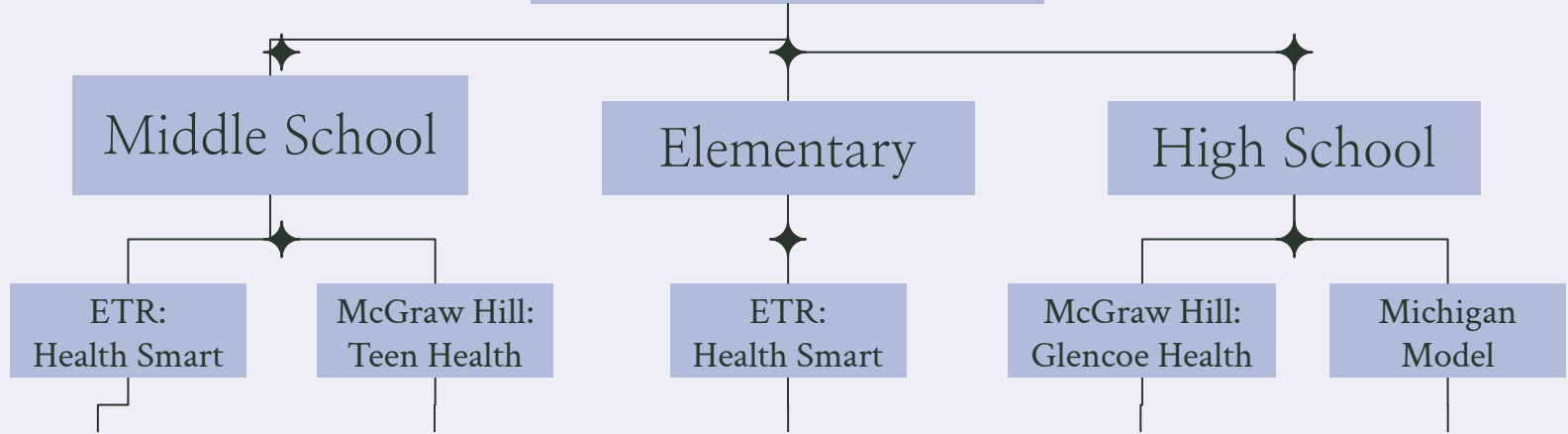
