## Literacy Plan

In order to address deficits in literacy, all content areas will embed literacy practices within the curricula. Within Language Arts courses (English and Social Studies), educators will incorporate the Science of Reading in weekly lessons. Educators will promote fluency and comprehension through progress monitoring, evaluate proficiency and celebrate growth using the NWEA, create a love for reading my modeling and tracking student progress through Accelerated Reader and STAR. Educators will ensure classroom texts are at, or above, grade level. All educators will receive professional development in the Science of Reading. A new literacy curriculum built on evidence based research and aligned to the Science of Reading will be implemented. Wilson Reading System will be utilized for students qualifying for Reading Intervention.
