What Is It?

- Career-focused programs that can start students on a pathway towards credentials in postsecondary, workplace, career and college coursework
- Technical, academic and employability skills through CTE courses, work-based learning and concurrent enrollment
- Sequence of courses allow high school students to explore career-focused courses in preparing students for post-secondary and career options
- Career Pathways offer students the skills necessary for post-secondary careers.

Many CTE courses are CE courses (they count for college credit). Check with the school counselor for more information about this.

CTE Students:

- Earn state and industry certifications and credentials recognized by industry.
- Apply academic learning to hands-on career opportunities.
- Seek internship opportunities to learn a skill set.

Skills Learned and Practiced:

- Opportunities are provided for students to participate in job shadowing, work-study, apprenticeships or internships.
- Generate numerous opportunities to learn about various careers.
- Provide connection to postsecondary education and employment through site visits.
- Provide opportunities to earn certificates in career areas.
