



Standardized Assessment Parental Exclusion Form

Box Elder School District values the partnership we have with parents in educating their students. Based on Utah Board Rule 277-404-7, parents (or legal guardians) have the right to exclude their student from participation in certain standardized assessments. In order to exclude a student from an assessment, the parent/guardian should complete the form and email, mail, or hand-deliver it to the school administrator. Completion of this form ensures that administrators, teachers, and testing staff will be appropriately informed of parents' wishes and can act accordingly.

A parent who excludes a student from an assessment must understand that no score will be received for the specific assessment. Such an exclusion will not negatively affect a student's grade, nor will it limit the opportunities he/she has for participation in a full range of academic programs and services. However, parents should be aware that standardized test scores are often used to determine the specific instructional needs of students and may be used in making placement decisions regarding advanced courses/programs. If a parent excludes a student from testing, it is essential that they work collaboratively with teachers and administrators to ensure student success.

The data obtained from these assessments may be utilized by teachers and administrators to review student progress toward learning targets, plan instruction, provide teacher feedback, and give important achievement and accountability data to students, parents, and other stakeholders. Data from summative assessments also allows for public reporting about school quality. *All requests for Parental Exclusion must be received by the school no later than 24 hours prior to test administration.*

Description of State Assessments:

- RISE Summative English Language Arts/Literacy/Writing (grades 3-8) Summative assessment of Utah Core Standards for achievement and accountability; writing is only included in grades 5 and 8
- RISE Summative Math (grades 3-8) Summative assessment of Utah Core Standards for achievement and accountability
- RISE Summative Science (grades 4-8) Summative assessment of Utah Core Standards for achievement and accountability
- RISE Interim (grades 3-8) Periodic assessment, local school choice, 2 opportunities, no state data collection
- RISE Benchmark modules Formative instruction (grades 3-8), local school or teacher choice, no state data collection
- Acadience Reading (formerly DIBELS) Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy (grades K-3), given fall, mid-year and end-of-year to test reading skills
- Acadience Math assessment of understanding of basic mathematical concepts and skills given fall, mid-year, and end-of-year
- **DLM Dynamic Learning Maps** (grades 3-11), spring summative alternate assessment for students with severe cognitive disabilities
- AAPPL ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages (grade 3-9), student proficiency of target language in a dual language immersion program
- ACT (grade 11) College readiness assessment covering reading, math, English, science, and writing
- **Utah Aspire Plus** (grades 9 and 10) Hybrid of the ACT and Utah Core test items. The assessments cover reading, English, Math, and Science and will provide students a predictive score for the ACT.
- CTE Skill Certification Assessments End-of-course competency-based student assessments in Career and Technical Education required for certification
- High School Civics Exam Locally administered civics exam, questions from the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Test, passing score of 35 out of 50 questions required for graduation
