FACULTY AND COUNSELING SERVICES

Faculty: 101, 74 with Masters Degree or beyond and 1 PhD.

<u>The Counseling Department</u> provides a comprehensive program that addresses the academic, career and personal/social development of all students. The staff includes four full time counselors and three full time support staff. In addition, services of a full-time School Psychologist and a Student Assistance Counselor are available.

CAREER EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Theodore Roosevelt High School is a member of the Six District Educational Compact (SDEC). The SDEC offers twenty seven career-technical programs. All SDEC programs, with the exception of auto specialization, provide opportunity for students to earn College Tech Prep status. College Tech Prep is an infrastructure that provides students with a program of study in a career pathway that incorporates academics, technical skills and careerrelated courses aligned with postsecondary education. TRHS has eleven career-technical programs that equip students for high-skill, high-wage careers demanded in a competitive economy, including: Athletic Healthcare and Fitness; Business Management; Computer Aided Design Engineering Technologies; Construction Technologies; Cosmetology; Electronics, Robotics, Programming; Engineering Academy; Forestry and Landscape Management; Health Careers Technologies; Marketing Management and Teaching Professions.

DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY INFORMATION

Theodore Roosevelt High School is widely respected for its established traditions of academic excellence and co-curricular activities. The first class graduated in 1869. Roosevelt is a comprehensive public school that is part of a Six District Career Education Compact. The city is the largest in Portage County and is home of Kent State University. The diversity of our student body enhances and enriches our educational environment. This is a community with a reputation for consistently supporting education.

SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

Theodore Roosevelt High School is recognized as a School of Excellence by the State Ohio.

<u>Enrollment</u>: 934 plus 314 Six District Educational Compact students, with 210 in the senior class

<u>Accreditation</u>: North Central Accrediting Association and Ohio Department of Education

<u>Schedule</u>: Classes meet 51 minutes per day, 5 days per week, 18 weeks per semester.



ACADEMY PROGRAM

<u>Expedition Academy</u> is based on a model developed by Harvard University and Outward Bound. It seeks to create an alternative learning experience through the integration of English, history, physical education and health with outdoor skills and community service. This is a college preparatory academy.

SERVICE ORIENTED COURSEWORK

<u>Riders Taking Action</u> is a senior course that fosters effective community leadership through the action of service and scholarship. Students learn the rationale behind their service and discover how to best approach its implementation.

<u>Leadership Planning Committee</u> is intended for experienced leaders to be an integral part of a team to design and implement a yearly leadership-training program for Roosevelt High School students. This 3-day retreat is held in November with a service project component afterward.

GRADING SYSTEM

The policy is based on a 4.0 unweighted scale, 4.5 weighted for advanced courses and a 5.0 weighted scale for AP/dual enrollment courses.
