We have much to celebrate on the academic front this school year. Our staff has been hard at work collaborating to ensure ALL of our students will have equitable access to aligned learning standards, across all courses.

Some of the work we've done over the past couple of years includes:


- Aligning our instruction and building processes with <u>Ohio's Continuous</u> <u>Improvement Model.</u>
- Implementing Professional Learning Communities/Teacher Based Teams to update and align our curriculum maps across content areas, develop common assessments, and analyze student data in order to inform, adjust and improve instruction.
- In 2019, our district was awarded <u>Ohio's Comprehensive Literacy State Grant</u>. At the high school, the grant has supported our on-going professional development in adolescent literacy. We've been fortunate to have the grant to support our secondary literacy coaches as well as a district Family Engagement Coordinator and Continuous Improvement/Instructional Coach.
- The research shows that students who read, write and discuss everyday in every course have higher levels of academic success. Our expectation at Roosevelt continues to be the implementation of Write to Learn Strategies across all of courses everyday.
- Starting this month, our staff will also begin working in collaboration to implement the instructional practices of <u>Teacher Clarity Playbook</u>.
