Grades Pre K-1

Pre K: We have had a great week. The students are adjusting well to the classroom rules and routines. We began talking about different feelings and emotions. Ask your child to tell you about a new feeling/emotion they learned. It was great to see so many of you at Open House. Thank you for visiting! Have a great weekend.

Beck: The K Krew has been busy learning routines! Our rules in the K class are: 1. Stay in your spot. 2. Quiet voices and kind words. 3. Follow teacher directions. 4. Keep your body to yourself. Please go over them with your child. We started working in our Handwriting Without Tears booklets on the letters E and F. Have a great weekend!

Lamothe: What a busy week! The students are settling into their daily routine and making new friends. We did "Me Bags" on Wednesday and shared 3 items that describe our personality. We reviewed our alphabet letters and numbers 1-10 along with practicing how to write our names. The students are familiar with our Stoplight Behavior Chart and know the consequences of their choices. Students will be tested by Title 1 by the end of this week, which will determine their readability level. We'll start our RED folders within the next several weeks. Thanks to all the parents who sent in clothes for their child in their "Just In Case Bag." Having an extra set on hand in the case of an emergency is helpful.

Brewer: Another very productive week in Grade 2. This week we began Everyday Math. We talked about where we find numbers in the world and working with number lines. We reviewed addition facts and learned some new strategies. We continued to review rules and procedures and talked more about Whole Body Listening and Tattling. Students picked out their Read to Self spot and we practiced building stamina. They received their Work Folders and got introduced to our spelling process. Title 1 finished DRA testing on all the students, so I can determine appropriate leveled books to send home in the RED bags. Ask your child to tell you about James and the Giant Peach, our read aloud. Thank you to the Ripley family for the paper towels.

Northrup: We had a productive and busy week in Grade 3. The kiddos continued to review rules and procedures, started cursive, took an Everyday Math assessment, began work on our geography unit, and had lots of fun!!! We will be doing NWEA testing on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. NWEA testing in 3rd grade consists of math, reading, and language arts. Please be sure your child gets lots of rest this weekend. I noticed many kiddos were very tired this week. Reading Logs are due EVERY Friday. I am asking the children to read 100 minutes per week. Student of the Week-Thomas

Trask: The students will be taking NWEA tests next week. Please have them get a plenty of rest each night.

We are slowly transitioning from summer mindsets to school mindsets. This is a challenge for some of the kids.

Also, on the school supply list I asked that kids do not bring toys from home. Please make sure that your child doesn't because it becomes a distraction for them and others.
