## Living Life on 2 Wheels



All Kids Bike Learn-To-Ride Bike Program Implemented in 16 Jefferson County Schools with 4 more surrounding Schools receiving the program this Spring through health and wellness challenges presented by #30ForTheKids.

Living Life on 2 Wheels, a Jefferson County MO non-profit, partnered with All Kids Bike® with a goal to launch the Learn-To-Ride bike program in 35 Jefferson County elementary schools. Living Life on 2 Wheels received support from Home Service Oil and Express Mart, the Jefferson Foundation, Enterprise Bank, Walmart Festus, Aldi, Delta Dental, Leader Wedding Fair, and many generous advocates of the sport of cycling. Home Depot Festus has donated materials to build storage systems for each school to hold its fleet.

Plattin Primary accepted their fleet of 24 bikes on Monday, April 11. With the help of volunteers from Living Life on 2 Wheels, the bikes were fully assembled and ready for kids in less than one hour. An assembly was held with the first grade and kindergarten students to introduce the bikes to them and allow them to take a few laps on the balance bikes. Next year, when the program is fully implemented during PE class, the students will start on the balance bikes (with no pedals) and then transition to pedaling all on their own. The students of Plattin Primary, along with their PE Teacher, Coach Wilson, are excited to bring the program to the students next year.

Plattin Primary accepted their fleet of 24 bikes on Monday, April 11. With the help of volunteers from Living Life on 2 Wheels, the bikes were fully

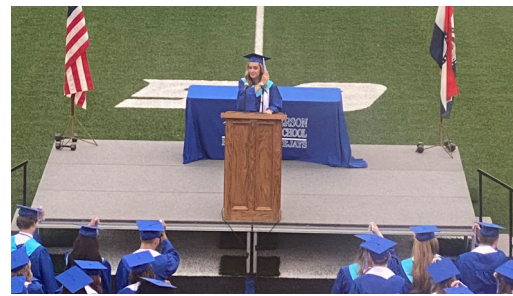

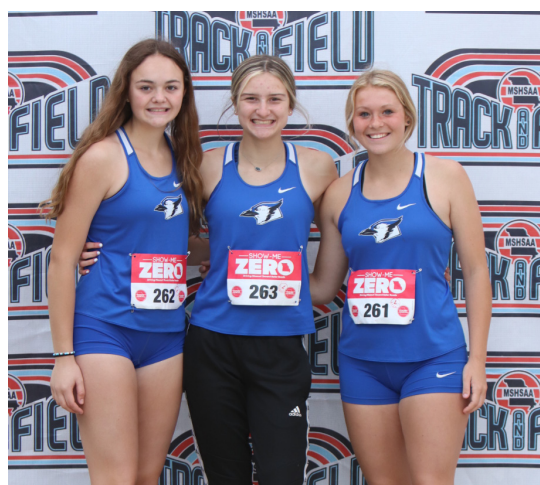
# Spring Sports Season Recaps

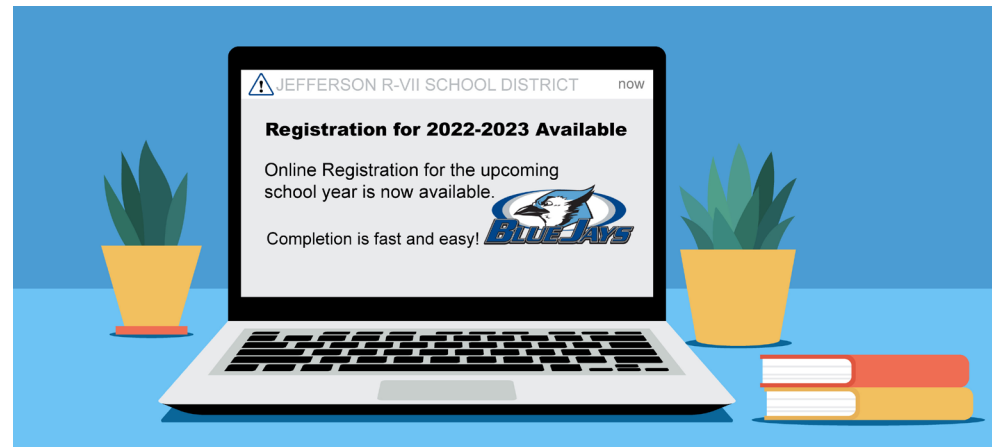
