





You can now obtain your certification to become a substitute teacher in Missouri through completing Frontline Substitute Teacher Training, as approved by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The training consists of approximately 20 hours of content specifically designed for substitute teachers and aligned to Missouri Teaching Standards. Upon completion, you will receive a Frontline Certificate of Completion demonstrating your readiness to obtain a Missouri substitute teacher license but more importantly, you'll have the confidence of knowing you are prepared to enter the classroom.

Genevieve Dragons that they eventually fell short, losing 41-34. The Bluejays bounced back with a big win over state ranked St. Vincent with a score of 46-28. It was the first conference loss of the season for St. Vincent and the Bluejays finished the regular season with a 5-4 record. The first round of districts the Bluejays battled with John Burroughs, but fell short 17-14 OT game. The Jefferson Football team finished the season with a 5-5 record and in 3rd place in the I-55 conference.
