Parents are given information packets in August with Parental/family engagement plans, surveysuggestions for parents to encourage and advance student achievement, a schedule of parental involvement activities offered throughout the year, and information on how they can communicate with teachers.

Parents may check student's grades on Eschool through Home Access (HAC). Parent information is available in the counselor's office. The Title 1 Plan is located in the office at CHS. Parents are given surveys throughout the year for parental input.

With available funds, the school will purchase parenting skills books, magazines and other resources that can be checked out.

The student handbook has the procedures to resolve conflict and problems for parents. It also defines conflict and how problems are identified.

CHS has a facilitator who will work with the principal and committee to plan, and meet with parents.

7. How will your school engage parents in the evaluation of your parent and family engagement efforts?

The school will engage parents in the annual evaluation of the Title I, Part A Program's parent and family engagement efforts through an annual evaluation using a comprehensive needs assessment filled out by

teachers, parents and school staff. The Title I committee, made up of teachers, parents and school staff, will determine the effectiveness of the parent and family engagement plan and make changes if warranted. While collecting evidence about satisfaction with the program and the school's efforts to increase parent and family engagement will be a part of the evaluation, the survey will also collect specific information on the (1) growth in number of parents participating in workshops and meetings; (2) specific needs of parents; (3) effectiveness of specific strategies; and (4) engagement of parents in activities to support student academic growth.
