As initial proof of residency, the person with whom the student lives in the District and who claims custody of the student must attach one item from Category I and two items from Category II, all of which must be acceptable to the District. It is not required to show personal information (account #'s, payment amounts \$, etc.) on these forms. Please feel free to block out any of the personal information that does not relate to proof of your residency. All documents must be current and include the address of the student's residence.

Category I (one document required)

Homeowners:

- Most recent property tax bill
- Current Mortgage statement or mortgage papers/ closing papers(if closing was within 60 days)

Renters:

- Signed and dated lease and proof of last month's payment (canceled check or receipt)
- Letter of Residence from Landlord and proof of last month's payment

Category II (two documents required- must have current address)

Drivers License	Most recent credit card bill
Vehicle Registration	Current Public Aid card
Voter Registration	Current homeowners/renters insurance policy and payment receipt
	Most recent gas, electric, water bill (not cell phone bill)

Proof of Residency Policy does not apply to Homeless students and families.

_____ Student is enrolling based on the determination of DCFS

Illinois law has made it a crime, punishable by imprisonment and fine, (Class C Misdemeanor) to knowingly or willfully present any false information regarding the residency of a student for purposes of enabling that student to attend on a tuition-free basis or to knowingly enroll or attempt to enroll as a student on a tuition-free basis when the student is known to be a non-resident of the School District. The District will seek prosecution to the full extent of the law any person who the District believes has committed any residency-related violation. Additionally, a civil lawsuit may be initiated by the District.
