## Superintendent's Message

Dear North Lyon County School Community,

The USD 251 Board of Education has been proactive in recent years by developing a written five-year capital outlay improvement plan outlining the districts budget priorities. These capital outlay priorities serve to ensure careful planning to obtain the best results in maintaining the school facilities and other property. These best results include providing our students with the most effective learning environment and resources, managing risk, and maintaining efficiency in the budget and operations by avoiding a back log of capital outlay needs. During the 2022-2023 school year, USD 251 has completed the following capital outlay projects:

- → Cafeteria/kitchen floor replacement at NLC Elementary
- → New school bus ordered/delivered
- → South gym bleacher replacement at NHHS
- → South gym scoreboard replacement at NHHS
- → NHHS roof replacement
- → NHHS security fence completed
- → NLC fence repairs completed
- → Early Learning Center building & playground (four-year old pre-school completed 80% grant funded)
- → Early Learning Center furniture, curriculum, learning manipulatives (100% grant funded)
- → Early Learning Center security cameras completed (grant funded)
- → Admire baseball field lights repaired
- → Americus baseball/softball field scoreboards ordered
- → Allen softball field restroom remodel/concession stand painting (currently in progress, work being completed by NHHS Agriculture Mechanics class)
- → NLC gym bleachers repair completed
- → Chromebook replacement completed
- → NLC annex remodeling for weight room (in progress, to be completed June 2023)
- → NLC weight room equipment ordered
- → Milk cooler replacement at NHHS (100% grant funded)
- → New ice machines at NLC, NHHS (100% grant funded)
- → I-Pads for grades K-2 (grant funded)
- → Storage sheds 14'X40' (2 sheds) ordered to be delivered May 2023 (100% grant funded)
- → HVAC for NLC weight room (100% grant funded)
- → Door security systems installed on 3 doors at NHHS
- → Door security system installed on district office door
- → Door security systems installed on Early Learning Center door
- → Windows at NLC/Office, Music Room, Science Room (\$150,000 grant) to be completed in May 2023
- → Windows at NHHS/Main Gym, Office (\$150,000 grant) to be completed in May 2023

## The currently planned 2023-2024 projects are as follows:

- → New school bus ordered (to be delivered summer 2023)
- → SUV replacement (2 vehicles) ordered/delivered early
- → NHHS floor replacement (2 rooms) FACS kitchen, teacher lounge
- → NHHS hallway lockers (2 sections in southeast hallway) three-year old used lockers ordered/delivery summer 2023
- → NHHS track repair (completed early)
- → NLC gym scoreboard replacement ordered/installation summer 2023
- → NLC gym floor sanding/refinishing (scheduled for June 2023)
- → Chromebook replacement


- → NLC concrete repairs
- → NHHS concrete repairs
- → Parking lot repairs
- → NLC concession stand repairs
- → District office tuck pointing
- → District office roof repair
- → NHHS South gym cover insulation



USD 251 held a Special Board of Education Meeting on April 26<sup>th</sup> where Dr. G. Kent Stewart presented his completed school facilities study. As I stated in the January 2023 USD 251 Newsletter, the Strategic Planning Committee appointed by the board will begin meeting in May 2023. The Strategic Planning Committee will be reviewing the school facilities study and engage in long-term strategic planning by reviewing USD 251's four strategic directions adopted by the board in early 2022. Again, those areas are:

- 1) Improving student achievement
- 2) Recruiting, developing, and retaining quality staff
- 3) Engaging and involving all district stakeholders
- 4) Managing the school district's budget & resources effectively.

This includes engaging the community in researching potential solutions for school district facilities. Again, as I stated in the January 2023 Newsletter, the Strategic Planning Committee could potentially meet over a long period of time if necessary. After the committee has studied all of the relevant information pertaining to the facilities study and the four strategic directions of the school district, the committee will provide feedback to the USD 251 Board of Education.

### FFA Update

The Northern Heights FFA Chapter has been busy since we have returned from spring break. We have competed in multiple district and regional competitions as well as participated in some local activities in the community.

In March, 14 students attended the Fort Scott Community College Aggie Day competitions. The entomology team of Kelton Bish, Cheyenne Paige, and TJ Dean placed 8th with Kelton Bish placing as the 6th high individual. In the food science contest, Mariah Anstey placed 8th, and our floriculture team placed 9th. Jena Hall competed in the East Central District Creed Speaking competition and finished in 4th place.



April started with students attending the East Central FFA District Banquet. Bethany DeDonder was elected to serve as the 2023-2024 East Central District Vice-President. The next day, 16 members traveled to Iola to compete at the Allen County Community College Aggie Day. The floriculture team placed 10th, entomology was 7th, food science was 5th, and livestock was 2nd. Individually, Kelton Bish finished 8th in entomology, Sadie Bathurst was 3rd in food science, Mariah Anstey was 9th in vet science, Braxton Young was 8th in livestock and Bethany DeDonder as 5th in livestock. The next week, a group of students traveled to Council Grove to compete in the Regional Envirothon Competition. The group of freshmen competed well and learned a lot as we look to improve our results in the coming years. Later in the week, a small group traveled to Paola to compete in the Miami County Aggie Day Competition for a final tune-up before State CDE's in May. Our final competitions of the month were livestock and food science held in Alma. The livestock team placed 8th overall with Bethany DeDonder finishing as the 9th high individual. In food science, the A-team placed 4th and Hope Miller was the 10th high placing B-team individual.

Members also completed a couple of community service projects in April. During the in-service day in April, a group of FFA members came to the school to make dog treats and chew toys to donate to the local animal shelter. Later in the month, 8 FFA members helped with the annual Lyon County Farm Bureau Day on the Farm. Members presented about

the US Dairy Industry as well as presenting about sheep and serving as group leaders in

the morning.

We wrapped up our month and FFA year with our annual Chapter FFA Banquet and Awards night. Members were recognized for their work throughout the year. Members were awarded Greenhand and Chapter FFA Degrees as well as recognized for their participation throughout the year.


It has been a busy month since spring break as we have prepared ourselves for the end of the year and State CDE's coming up at the beginning of May.
