RE: Financial Report for the Period Ending March 31, 2016

Overall

The financial statements reflect 75% of the year completed.

The Academy's cash balance at March 31, 2016 is \$1,563.790.

Operating Summary

- Year-to-date operation expenses and revenues show operational revenues exceeded expenditures by \$527,681.
- Operation revenue is currently less than last year by \$601,182, which is due to grant proceeds received in the prior year for technology purchases.
- Operating expenses are less than last year by \$726,901, which is due to the technology purchases from the above grant and facilities expenditures, which are not funded by State Facility funds.

Operating Expense Report

Operating expenses are in line with the prior year, with the exception of Technology and Supplies. This is due to the grant received last year to purchase computers, I-pads and software.

Grant Information

Grant 2014-1330

Technology grant in the amount of \$452,956. Proceeds was spent to purchase Computers, I-pads and software. This grant is now complete.

Grant 2014-1156

Grant in the amount of \$483,813 to forge a relationship with Crystal Bridges of American Art to use art integration to deliver curriculum content. Proceeds were to be used for salaries, benefits, professional development, consultant fees and supplies/equipment. We currently have approximately \$80,246 remaining to be expended.





CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This agreement is made effective as of April ______, 2016, by and between New Design School ("NDS"), an Arkansas Nonprofit Corporation located at 217 E. Dickson St., Fayetteville, AR 72701 and Arkansas Arts Academy Foundation ("AAAF"), an Arkansas Nonprofit Corporation located at 1110 W. Poplar, Rogers, AR 72756.

WHEREAS, NDS owns and operates digital design and digital arts programs. AAAF owns and operates an open enrollment public charter school offering fine arts education to K-12 students throughout Arkansas. AAAF does not currently offer a digital design or digital arts curriculum but wishes to do so.

WHEREAS, AAAF desires to expand its curriculum and hire NDS to create, provide and teach a digital design and digital arts curriculum for the benefit of AAAF and AAAF's students which it currently does not have.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the recitals above and the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

DESCRIPTION AND PERFORMANCE OF SERVICES

- 1.1 Upon the execution of this agreement and the payment of the initial consideration set out herein, NDS will create a curriculum to teach digital design and digital arts to students of AAAF.
- 1.2 On or about August 8, 2016, NDS will provide instructors to begin teaching this curriculum to students of AAAF as an expansion of AAAF's current curriculum. NDS will provide instruction in this developed digital arts curriculum to students of AAAF, in designated space provided by AAAF.
- 1.3 AAAF agrees to provide all needed space, equipment, software and any and all other items required to implement the curriculum, at its own expense.
- 1.4 NDS agrees to provide the curriculum and qualified instructors to teach this new curriculum. The curriculum will be taught to two (2) separate classes per semester with each class having two (2) separate one and a half (1.5) hour sessions each week at times to be agreed upon by the parties. In addition to the two (2) separate one and a half (1.5) hour sessions each week, there will be two (2) separate Friday sessions per month during each semester.
- 1.5 NDS instructors will provide individual grading to AAAF for each student enrolled in each AAAF course taught by NDS instructors in accordance with grading schedules and parameters as provided by AAAF.
- 1.6 Within thirty (30) days of the execution of this agreement, AAAF will provide NDS with copies of any and all written policies applicable to its curriculum, disciplinary policies and

- code of conduct or other rules and regulations that are applicable to the services provided by NDS.
- 1.7 Upon the any revision or alteration of any existing written policies applicable to its curriculum, disciplinary policies and code of conduct or other rules and regulations that are applicable to the services provided by NDS, AAAF shall notify NDS in writing of any such revisions or alterations.
- 1.8 Any and all suspected violations of AAAF's disciplinary policies and/or code of conduct policies shall be reported to AAAF at which time any and all responsibility or liability of NDS shall become that of AAAF.

ARTICLE 2

TERM/TERMINATION

- 2.1 The term of this agreement shall be for three (3) years commencing on the date of execution of this agreement.
- 2.2 Without cause, by either party, upon at least (30) days written notice given by either NDS or AAAF to the other party, this agreement shall terminate on the future date specified in such notice, which shall not be prior to the end of any semester or term which has begun prior to such notice of termination being given.
- 2.3 If notice of termination is given during any current term or semester, any and all payments owed under the terms of this contract shall remain due and owed through the completion of such semester or term.

ARTICLE 3

CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 AAAF will pay an initial payment of Five Thousand Dollars (5,000.00) to NDS at the execution of this contract to cover the initial expense of developing the curriculum.
- 3.2 Beginning August 1, 2016, AAAF will pay Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the implementation and teaching of this new curriculum for the first school year. The Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for this first school year is to be paid in twelve (12) separate monthly instalments of \$1,666.66 per month on or before the 5th day of each month.
- 3.3 For the 2nd and 3rd years of this contract AAAF will pay Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per year to be paid in twelve (12) separate monthly instalments of \$2,083.33 per month on or before the 5th day of each month.
- 3.4 AAAF will be solely responsible for any and all costs and expenses associated with this contract other than those associated with the development of the curriculum and the payment of instructors by NDS. AAAF agrees to reimburse NDS and/or its instructors for any and all out of

pocket expenses associated with the implementation of the curriculum and instruction, including, but not limited to, instructor background checks, software and licensing fees, online teaching subscriptions, etc...

ARTICLE 4

RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

- 4.1 It is understood by the parties that at all times this agreement is in place, NDS and its instructors and/or representatives will be operating as an independent contractor(s) and not as employees of AAAF.
- 4.2 AAAF will not direct or control how the independently developed curriculum will be implemented or taught nor provide any benefits of any kind to the benefit of NDS or its instructors and/or representatives.
- 4.3 It is further understood that neither NDS nor the instructors and/or representatives provided by NDS will have no employee relationship with AAAF.

ARTICLE 5

LICENSURE AND QUALIFICATIONS

5.1 All parties to this Agreement, and their representatives, shall have and maintain on a current basis all appropriate licenses, certifications, and other permissions necessary to lawfully provide their services.

ARTICLE 6

ENTIRE AGREEMENT

6.1 This agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement whether oral or written. This agreement superseded any prior written or oral agreements between the parties.

ARTICLE 7

INSURANCE

- 7.1 AAAF and NDS shall each maintain liability coverage with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 (one million dollars) per occurrence and \$1,000,000 (one million dollars) annual aggregate.
- 7.2 Within thirty (30) days of the execution of this Agreement, AAAF and NDS shall furnish each other with copies of all insurance policies.

ARTICLE 8

INDEMNIFICATION

- 8.1 AAAF shall forever hold NDS, its Board of Directors, its agents, and representatives (hereinafter collectively referred to as "NDS") harmless of, from, and against, and shall defend NDS, and any and all costs, expenses, and damages which might be sustained by NDS (including attorneys' fees) by virtue of, or arising out of or in connection with its relationship with AAAF hereunder, including but not limited to, a finding by a court of competent jurisdiction that AAAF was or is the apparent or ostensible agent of NDS or a breach by AAAF of his/her obligations hereunder.
- 8.2 NDS shall forever hold AAAF, its agents and representatives harmless of, from, and against, and shall defend AAAF against any and all costs, expenses, and damages which might be sustained by AAAF(including attorneys' fees) by virtue of, or arising out of or in connection with the services of NDS hereunder, including but not limited to, a finding by a court of competent jurisdiction that NDS was or is the apparent or ostensible agent of AAAF or a breach by NDS of its obligations hereunder.
- 8.3 Any matters concerning this agreement that the parties cannot resolve themselves will be resolved through arbitration using the rules of the American Arbitration Association. Costs and attorney's fees will be awarded to the prevailing party. As such, each party herein waives their right to a trial by jury to resolve any dispute arising herein.

ARTICLE 9

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

- 9.1 Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to constitute either party a partner, employee, or agent of the other, nor shall either party have authority to bind the other in any respect, it being intended that each shall remain an independent contractor solely responsible for its own actions.
- 9.2 No employee or agent of the other party hereto shall be considered an employee or agent of the other party hereto. Neither party shall have the right to direct or control the other in furnishing services or in the method or manner in which it performs its duties hereunder.

ARTICLE 10

NOTICES

10.1 All notices, demands, requests, or other communications which may be or are required to be given, served, or sent by any party to the other party pursuant to this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally, mailed by first-class, registered, or certified mail,

return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or transmitted by facsimile to the address listed above in this

- 10.2 Such notice or other communication shall be deemed sufficiently given or received for all purposes at such time as delivered to the address (with the return receipt, the delivery receipt, the affidavit of messenger, or the answer back being deemed conclusive evidence of such delivery) or at such time as delivery is refused by the addressee upon presentation.
- 10.3 Each party may designate by notice in writing a new address to which any notice or communication may thereafter be so given, served, or sent.

ARTICLE 11

TAXES

- 11.1 All taxes and other charges assessed by reason of AAAF's business, or profession shall be paid by AAAF.
- 11.2 All taxes and other charges assessed by reason of NDS's or its representatives' business, occupation or profession shall be paid by NDS or each individual representative.

ARTICLE 12

AMENDMENT

12.1 This agreement may only be modified by written agreement of the parties.

ARTICLE 13

SEVERABILITY

- 13.1 If any provision of this agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and enforceable.
- 13.2 If a court finds that any provision of this agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision, it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

ARTICLE 14

WAIVER OF CONTRACTUAL RIGHT

14.1 The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 15

JURISDICTION

15.1 This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Arkansas.

ARTICLE 16

MISCELEANOUS

- 16.1 Both parties recognize and acknowledge that the curriculum developed and taught by NDS is the intellectual property of NDS.
- 16.2 It is the explicit intention of the parties hereto that no person or entry other than the parties hereto, except governmental authorities to the extent required by law, is or shall be entitled to bring any action to enforce any provisions of this Agreement against either of the parties hereto, and that the covenants, undertakings, and agreements set forth in the Agreement shall be solely for the benefit of, and shall be enforceable only by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns as permitted hereunder.
- 16.3 This Agreement shall not be assignable by either party without prior written consent of the other party hereto.
- 16.4 Neither the waiver by either of the parties hereto of a breach of or a default under any of the provisions of this Agreement, nor the failure of either of the parties, on one or more occasions, to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement or to exercise any right or privilege hereunder, shall thereafter be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach or default of a similar nature, or as a waiver of any of such provisions, rights, or privileges hereunder.
- 16.5 No provisions of this Agreement shall be applied or construed in a manner inconsistent with applicable laws and regulations of the United States and the State of Arkansas.
