Principal Board Report – Matt (K8) Barb (HS):

Aaron Jones sharing Museum Initiative: Aaron shared about our Museum Initiative. Sheena Racher was using Prehistoric Cave Drawings and Drop paint documents, Heather Wright, Science Teacher was teaching Innovator Portraits and Green Screen production, Julie Downum was teaching Field Journaling (Visual Journaling) and Star Inglesias was using Cultural Diversity Immerson Day showing Jose Poseda Social engagement.
