6. New Business:

Hight Jackson and Flintco presented their vision for our upcoming remodel build at the high school.

Overall

The financial statements reflect 42% of the year completed.

The Academy's cash balance at November 30, 2016 is \$1,232,845.

Operating Summary

- Year-to-date operation revenues exceeded expenditures by \$274,152.
- Operation revenue is currently in line with last year, with a small variance of \$6,029.
- Operating expenses increased over the prior year by \$88,838.

Operating Expense Report

Operating expenses are in line with the prior year with very little variances.




