Jami Forrester spoke about the proposed continuous learning calendar and how it would impact her family. Mrs. Forrester is a professor at NWACC and would not have breaks when we do and she doesn't want to put her student in day care during the break period.

Carla Laing spoke about the proposed continuous learning calendar and shared that she has other students in other traditional calendar districts that would not allow her to take vacation during our breaks.

Chris Leis spoke about the continuous learning calendar and that their youngest child is at AAA and their family has two college students that would not have breaks during our break periods. Ginny Pafford spoke on the continuous learning calendar and their family has been at AAA for 14 years and they love our school. Her challenge with the calendar is summer jobs for her students and visitation schedules that would in affect leave her little time with her children.

Brooke Payne shared her comments on the continuous learning calendar and this is her family's 7th year at AAA. She felt that we were finally reaching stability here and why change something that is not broken. She shared there was some confusion as to whether the calendar was approved and official or a proposal.

Further discussion on calendar was postponed until later in the meeting.

Tony Beardsley shared that Alice Eastwood had tendered her resignation from the school board because she has accepted an appointment by Governor Hutchinson to the Ethics Panel in Little Rock and cannot be a member of two boards.

Mr. Beardsley asked the board for nominations to fill the open seat. Joe DeRouen nominated Asele Mack and Howard Alsdorf nominated Jami Forrester. Mr. Beardsley called for a vote on Asele Mack and there were 6 votes for and 0 against. Mr. Beardsley called for a vote on Jami Forrester and there were 0 votes for and 6 against. Ms. Mack was voted in as our new school board member.

Mr. Beardsley called for a motion to approve the Consent Agenda for January 2017, Dave Russell made a motion and Joe DeRouen 2^{nd} the motion and the motion passed in a 6 – 0 vote.

New Business

Principal Board Report – Matt Young (K8) Barb Padgett (HS)

Matt Young principal report: Mr. Young shared that Crystal Bridge night at the museum was a huge success. More than 200 people attended an amazing night. Parent Teacher conferences went very well last Friday and was well attended. Our Archery team competed in Bergman, AR in the regional archery competition. Our team was moved to a new much more competitive division and came in fourth overall with the highest score they had every achieved. We participated in professional development on campus today. EMS has currently received 165 Lottery Forms in addition to the 193 students on a waiting list. EMS has already received 65 intent to return forms.

Barb Padgett shared that Parent Teacher Conferences went well and the PTG served an amazing meal for teachers. The High School Art History Class will be going to Peel Mansion tomorrow to unwrap a new photography exhibit of photographs taken in South Arkansas. This will allow our students an almost curator experience. March 9th we will begin our production of 12th Night Shakespeare. Intent to return forms are coming in. March 15th is our college choice day and representatives from Kansas City Art College, Art Institute of Chicago and Belmont University with be in attendance. Open House is scheduled for March 14th and we are partnering with NWACC. Our professional development went extremely well and the staff were excited about collaborating on student needs and to be the best for our students.

Calendar discussion (action)

Mrs. Ley spoke about some confusion regarding the calendar and shared how important it was for us to do a better job in communicating with our parents and the public. Mrs. Ley shared a recent experience she had at Crystal Bridges and how one of our very own middle schooler shared her struggle with anxiety and how she paused a moment to breath and then continued on with her presentation. Mrs. Ley shared how utilizing the continuous learning calendar it would give our students and faculty an opportunity to breath and refresh themselves and that the calendar breaks didn't mean you have to take a vacation but just spend time together riding bikes, reading to refresh ourselves to return back to class ready to study.

Mr. Young was reintroduced and shared in depth about the continuous learning calendar. First he shared how thankful we all were that parents came and shared how passionate they were about this proposal. He shared how hard change can be for all of us, it's just not easy to change. The majority of our parents liked the idea, not 100%. When we make changes like this we are going to lose and gain some families. AAA would be the first school district to adopt a continuous learning calendar in Arkansas. We have made arrangements with the RAC, Boys and Girls Club and Safe Center to provide activities during our breaks. The calendar would also allow our teachers to make some extra income by providing Kid's College or other remediation or enrichment classes during the breaks. Statistics have shown fewer behavioral challenges with built in breaks.

Tony Beardsley ask the board for discussion about the proposed calendar. He shared that after hearing all the information he was not sure how he would vote. Board Members shared that they were thankful that parents took time out of their busy schedules to share. Some questions brought up was how many families would be adversely affected by the change, some families had already made travel arrangements according to the new schedule, do we need to make a decision tonight. Ms. Ley said we traditionally approved the calendar for the next year in February, and that parents need to know the decision before the Lottery ends. Tony Beardsley ask to entertain a motion to approve the continuous learning calendar, Anthony Porchia made the motion and it was seconded by Alicia Knotts and the motion passed 4 – 2.

- New Policies (Show new link) Mrs. Ley shared that our new policy book with revisions has been put on our web site and included our corrected name of Arkansas Arts Academy.
- Seek approval to hire a K-8 Assistant Principal for 2017-2018: Mrs. Ley brought for discussion hiring an Assistant Principal for the EMS campus that could back up at the high school as needed. Our numbers are such that we really need to have an assistant at the K8 campus. Matt is doing a great job but he needs some additional assistance. The salary would be approximately \$60,000 a year and could be covered by the savings we will have going with a food service company and having the new Assistant Principal supervise special education that is now being outsourced. Mr. Beardsley ask to entertain a motion to approve the hiring of an Assistant Principal. Dave Russell brought the motion and it was 2nd by Joe DeRouen and the motion passed in a 6 0 vote.

RE: Financial Report for the Period Ending January 31, 2017

Overall

The financial statements reflect 58% of the year completed.

The Academy's cash balance at January 31, 2017 is \$1,185,241.

Operating Summary

- Year-to-date operation revenues exceeded expenditures by \$22,862.
- Operation revenue is currently less than last year with a variance of \$61,647.
- Operating expenses increased over the prior year by \$251,455, we paid a portion of the staff bonuses in November before the holiday break, which amounted to \$40,750; paid New Design School in full \$20,000; Paid Community Creative Center \$22,600.

Operating Expense Report

Operating expenses are in line with the prior year with very little variances.

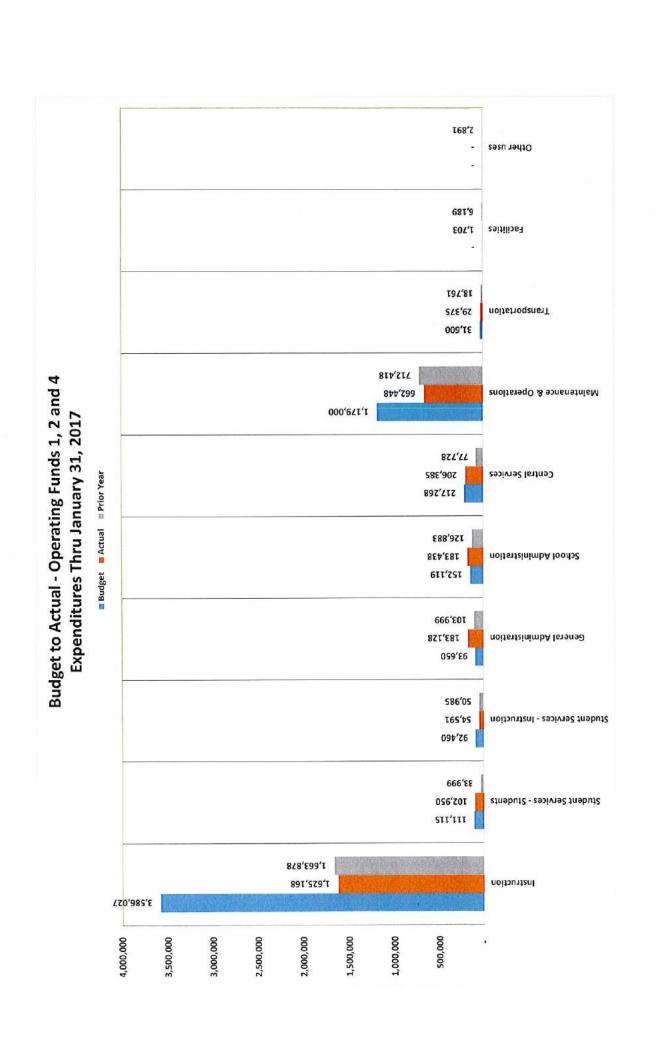

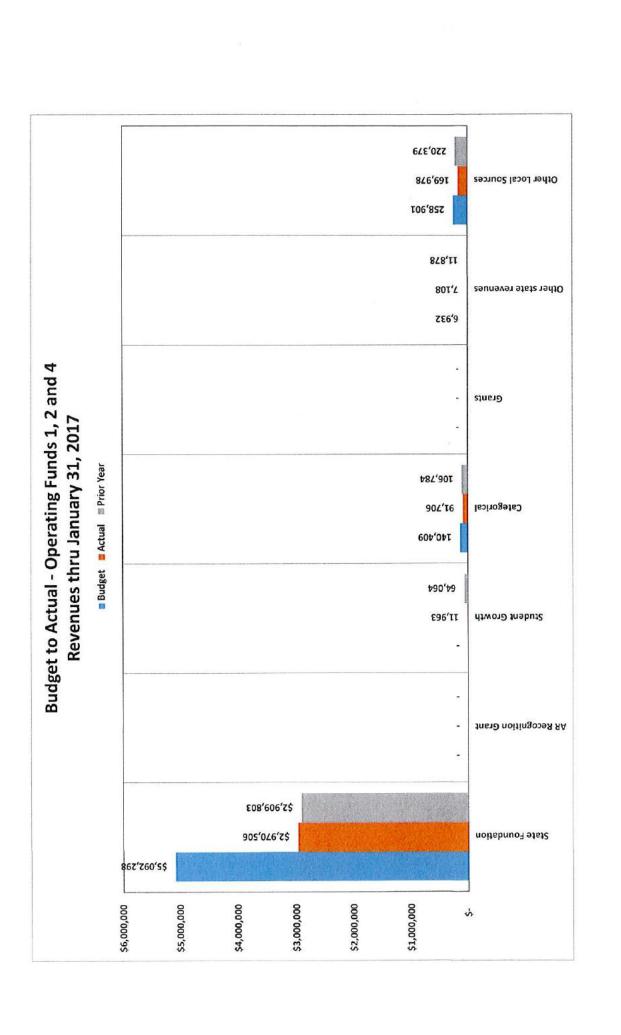
