RE: Financial Report for the Period Ending February 28, 2017

Overall

The financial statements reflect 67% of the year completed.

The Academy's cash balance at February 28, 2017 is \$1,601,866.

Operating Summary

- Year-to-date operation revenues exceeded expenditures by \$600,601, which is due to grant proceeds of \$400,000 received from the Walton Family Foundation.
- Operation revenue is currently more than last year with a variance of \$360,637, due to the Walton Family Foundation Grant.
- Operating expenses increased over the prior year by \$287,436. We paid a portion of the staff bonuses in November before the holiday break, which amounted to \$40,750; paid New Design School in full \$20,000; upgrade of chrome books.

Operating Expense Report

Operating expenses are in line with the prior year with very little variances.

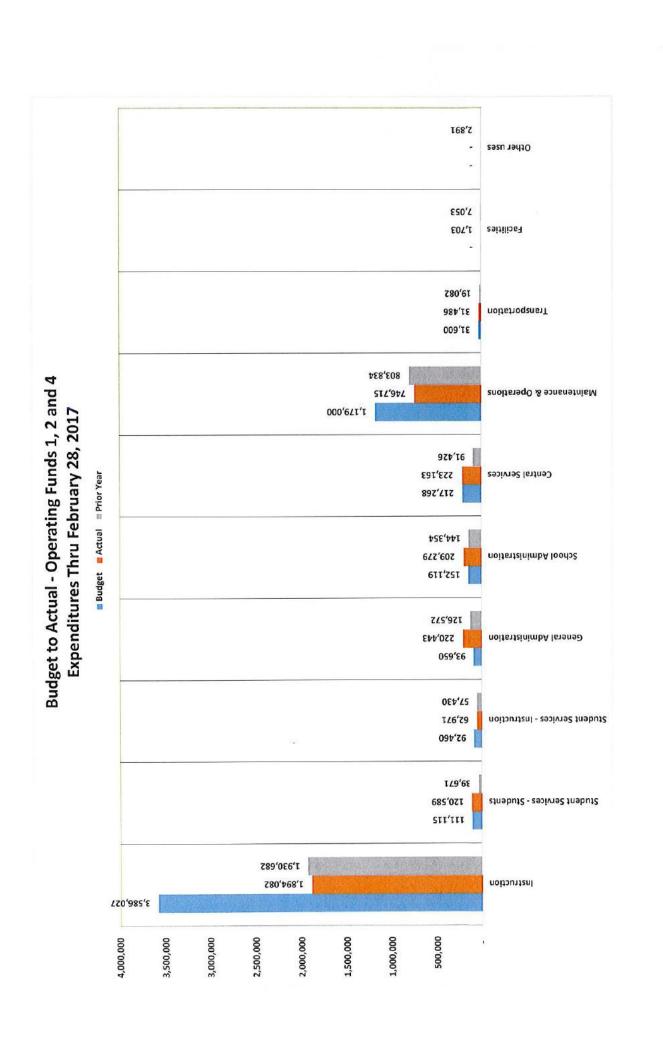

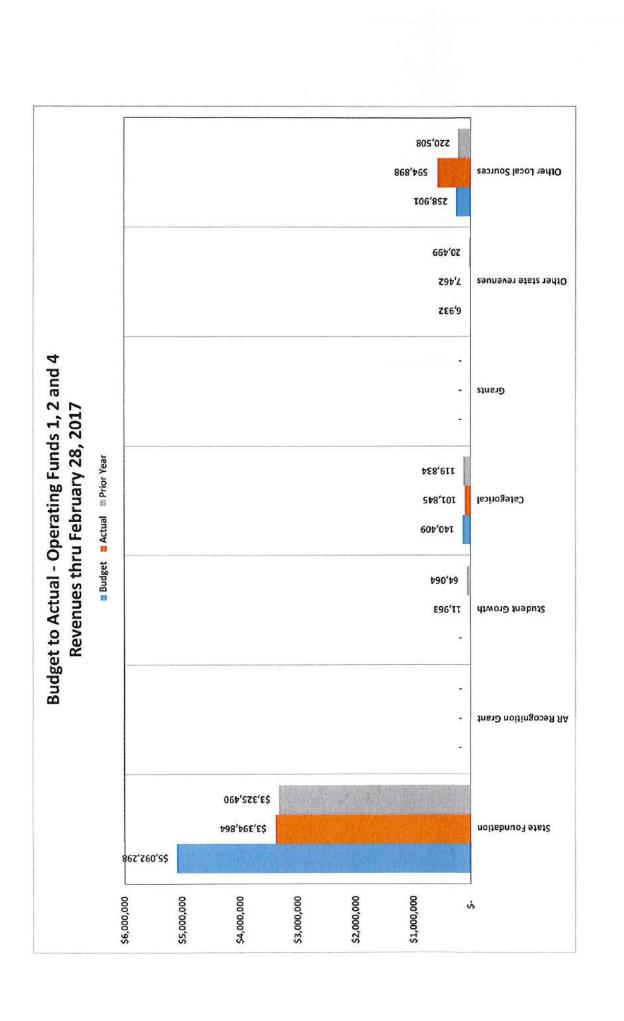
