High School Improvement Goal #1

GOAL: PROVIDE HIGH QUALITY CURRICULUM, ASSESSMENT, AND INSTRUCTION

- All teachers are guided by a document that aligns standards, curriculum, instruction, and assessment.
- Instructional Teams develop standards-aligned units of instruction for each subject and grade level.
- Units of instruction include standards-based objectives and criteria for mastery.
- Objectives are leveled to target learning to each student's prior mastery based on multiple points of data.

High School Improvement Goal #2

GOAL: PROVIDE A TIERED SYSTEM FOR INSTRUCTIONAL AND BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT

- All teachers assess student learning frequently with standards-aligned assessments.
- Instructional Teams use student learning data to identify students in need of instructional support or enhancement.
- The school implements a reliable and valid system-wide screening process for academics and behavior that includes the assessment of all students multiple times per year and establishes decision rules to determine those students in need of targeted intervention.
- The school tests each student at least 3 times a year to determine progress toward standards-based objectives.
- The school provides a modified schedule that allows for additional time for student tutoring and interventions during the school day.

High School Improvement Goal #3

GOAL: PROVIDE ALL STUDENTS WITH GUIDANCE AND SUPPORT TO PREPARE FOR COLLEGE AND CAREER.

- The school provides all students an adult mentor to assist students with goal setting and tracking.
