

#### **UACCM Concurrent Credit Partnership**

UACCM CORE Academy is a new concurrent enrollment partnership between UACCM and the South Conway County School District. Through this program, MHS students will have an opportunity to complete the Arkansas 35-hour General Education Core requirement before they graduate high school without leaving the MHS campus.


The 35-hour General Education Core is transferable to all public colleges in Arkansas. Students enrolled in the UACCM CORE Academy will be enrolled in UACCM courses, both on the high school campus as well as online courses taught by UACCM faculty.



Morrilton High School students can also enroll in UACCM's Career Center to take classes in technical/workforce programs, as well as other coursework on the UACCM campus. The UACCM concurrent credit partnership is an amazing opportunity and affordable way for high school students to jumpstart their college career and professional training by taking advantage of Conway County School Counts, Arkansas Concurrent Challenge, and SCCSD's contributions of \$56 per credit hour. The South Conway County School District will contribute up to \$56 per credit hour for ALL concurrent coursework.
