## **OVERVIEW**

## What is History Day?

National History Day is your opportunity to research a topic, event, or person in history. While you may select a topic from any historical era (i.e. Ancient, Medieval, Modern), consider choosing a topic that has many resources available to you to research. Your topic must align with the annual theme of History Day.

**Theme**: Triumph & Tragedy in History

There are 5 major steps involved:

1) **Topic**: Select a topic that aligns with this year's theme (Triumph & Tragedy in History)

2) **Research**: Research your topic using resources provided

3) **Thesis**: Create a thesis about your topic (will be put in your process paper)

4) **Process**: Write your process paper (includes a bibliography)

5) **Presentation**: Present your topic selecting one of the categories below:

<sup>\*</sup>A group may have between 2 and 5 students.

**Basic Rules** (more detailed rules can be found at link listed below):

- 1) Entry must relate clearly to theme and explain significance in history
- 2) Research is to be one's own. Do not share with another group.
- 3) Students in a group must all contribute. No students may be added or substituted once the project has begun.
- 4) All entries must be original ideas and research.
- 5) All research, design, and creation is students' responsibility, although parents and teachers may give advice and guide students toward the right resources.
- 6) No tampering with other NHD entries.
- 7) On contest day, the student(s) is/are responsible for being present and ready to present.
- 8) On contest day, any extra materials needed are the student's responsibility.
- 9) Be prepared to answer judges' questions about the content, your research, and creation.
- 10) No costumes, unless you are doing a performance.
- 11) No potentially dangerous items allowed (e.g. weapons, plants, animals, etc.)
- 12) The title of your work (if exhibit) is required and must be clearly visible (details and help will be given during one of the help sessions).
