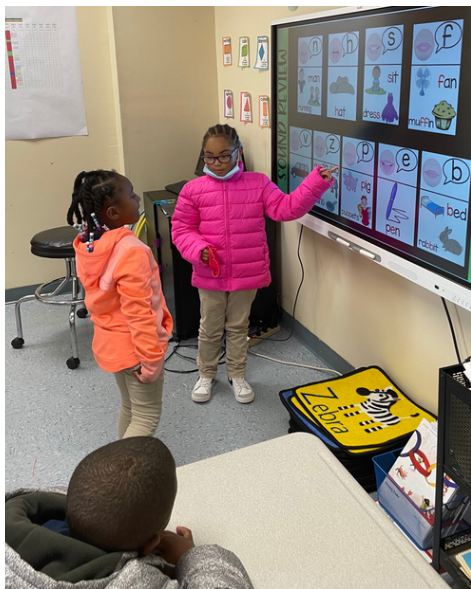

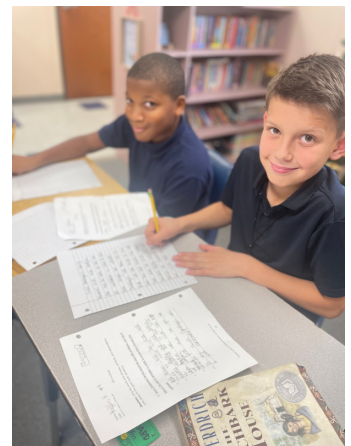
Leading Learning at CES

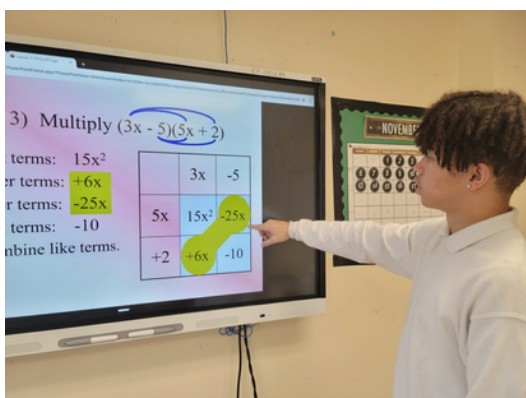
Fall Fest at JES
